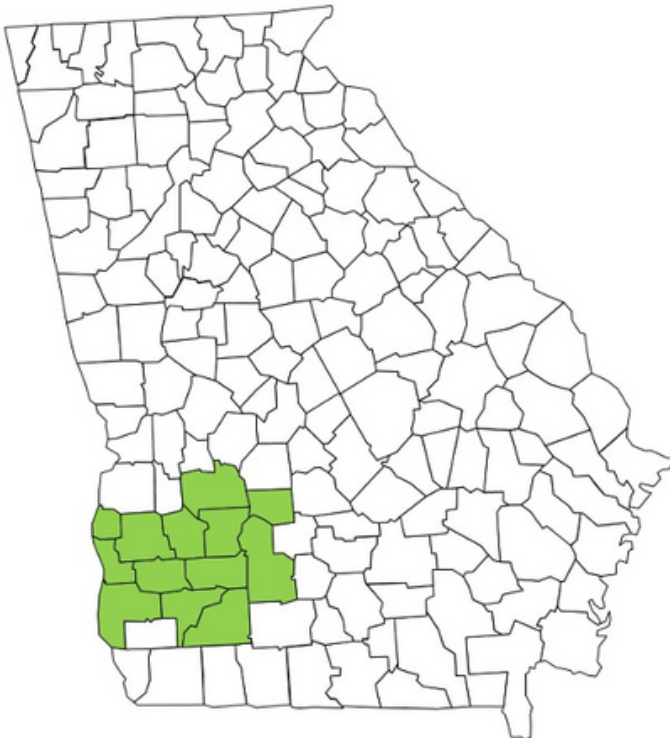

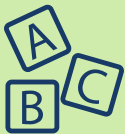


ABOUT RESILIENT SOUTHWEST GEORGIA (ALBANY)

Resilient Southwest Georgia (Resilient SWGA) is a coalition that serves thirteen counties in the Southwest Georgia – Albany region. Resilient SWGA was launched to advance awareness of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and the impact that they have on children, families, and communities. Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) refers to traumatic experiences or long-term events that can have lasting negative impact on the physical and mental wellbeing and health of children now and in the future in adulthood. ACEs can include abuse, neglect communal violence, poverty, inability to access social services or resources, and more. (To learn more about ACEs and related terms, such as “resilience” and “trauma informed” – take a look at Resilient Georgia’s learning cards [here](#).) In efforts to mitigate both exposure to ACEs and the negative impact of ACEs, Resilient SWGA brings a “trauma-informed” approach to build resilience and support community wellbeing.

Resilient SWGA has an overarching framework to guide their prevention of ACEs and intergenerational transfer by focusing on intervention from birth to adulthood. Resilient SWGA and its network of partners work to employ a united front to support well-being from birth to young adulthood, thus interrupting the cycle of ACEs in communities. The following graphic depicts the overarching framework that Resilient SWGA and United Way of Southwest Georgia have centered on to advance outcomes across all age groups; from early childhood to continued education and workforce age.

Policy & Legislation

This resource guide serves to support the approaches of Resilient SWGA by providing behavioral health resources to support communities across the life span. In addition, the coalition has identified several key priorities to support behavioral health initiatives and quality of life. The Key Priorities of Resilient Southwest Georgia are education, health, and income.

- Education – Access to quality education
- Health – Healthcare and well-being supports
- Income – Resources to advance economic mobility

Through several sectors of this resource guide, the resources aim to support these core components that influence behavioral health and quality of life. Resilient SWGA’s grounding in the aforementioned four pillars and the three founding priorities are central to their work in improving community health, and this resource guide serves as a tool to support current and future initiatives in the region.

HOW WILL THE MENTAL HEALTH PARITY ACT IMPACT ME?

The Mental Health Parity Bill (HB 1013) successfully passed in March 2022 with resounding bipartisan support and aims to expand access to affordable mental health treatment and behavioral health services across the state of Georgia. The new law now requires health insurance plans to cover mental health conditions in the same manner in which physical conditions are treated. In accordance with the law's passing, health insurance plans can no longer deny patients medically necessary treatment for mental health conditions.

In order to understand individual health plans, each consumer should review their **Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC)** and the **Summary Plan Description (SPD)** written in each plan.

If a consumer feels as though they have experienced a parity violation, they must first discuss the issue with their insurance provider and determine if it is necessary to file a formal appeal. If the insurance provider does not resolve the issue, the following state agencies are responsible for enforcement of parity in Georgia: **The Georgia Office of Insurance and Safety Fire Commissioner (OCI)**, and **The Georgia Department of Community Health (DCH)**.

*The state is responsible for the monitoring and enforcing of parity for private insurance plans, including individual, marketplace, small business, and large employer plans that are not self-funded. Note that large, self-funded corporate ERISA plans are regulated by the US Department of Labor (See <https://www.dol.gov/agencies/ebsa/laws-and-regulations/laws/mental-health-and-substance-use-disorder-parity>.) Also note that federal parity law does not apply to Medicare.

COMMUNITY RESOURCES FOR RESPONDING TO CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE

Mandated Reporting in Georgia: Georgia law requires anyone who works or volunteers at a child-serving agency to report suspected child abuse or neglect within 24 hours (O.C.G.A. 19-7-5). Frequently hospitals, schools and other facilities have an internal child abuse report protocol. You should be aware of this protocol and follow it. HOSPITALS

CRITICAL ACCESS HOSPITALS

Critical Access Hospital (CAH) designation is given by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to rural hospitals located at least 35-mile away from another hospital, with no more than 25 beds, providing 24/7 emergency care services.

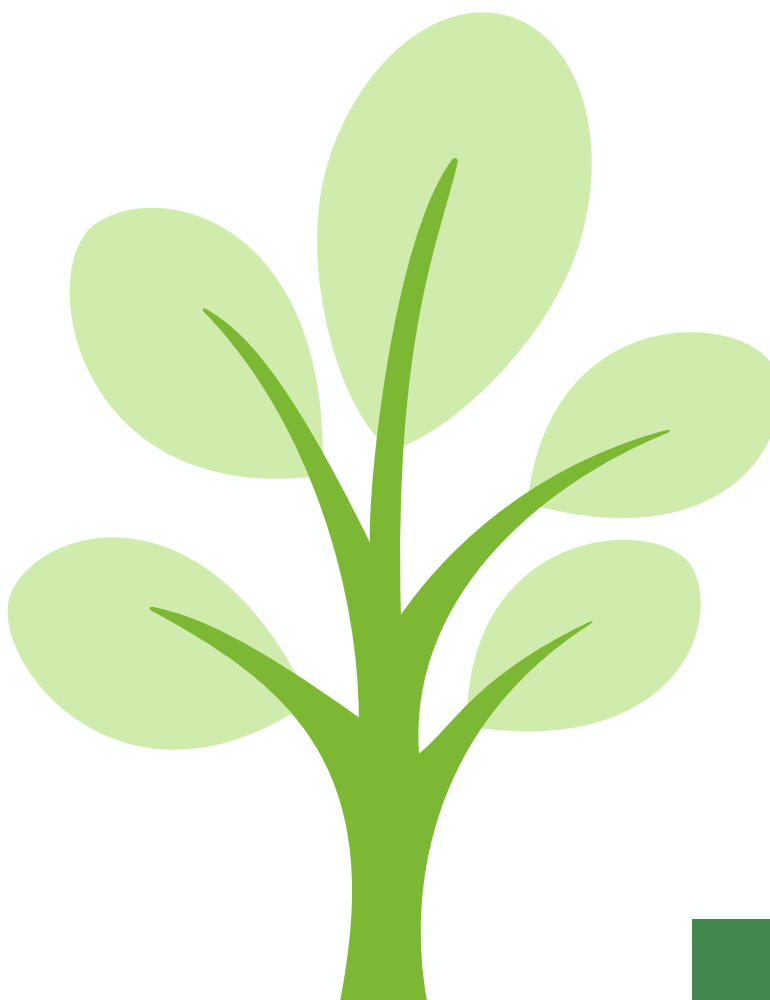
