“A Tale of Two Josephs”

This is the tale of two Josephs. Not fiction, but fact. One Joseph marks a beginning, and the other an end. One was a Christmas Joseph, and the other was a Good Friday Joseph. They stand one each at the ends of the life of Jesus—the one at his birth and the other at his death. Now, Joseph of Nazareth saw the beginnings of a life and heard the first cry of the infant Jesus. Joseph of Arimathea heard the last cry of a dying man on a cross. The Christmas Joseph, a man and a carpenter, helped Mary, his betrothed, to lay a baby in a manger. The Good Friday Joseph, a distinguished, wealthy legislator, carried a dead body to an empty tomb. He owned it, and it was conveniently near. No one had yet been buried there.

Joseph of Nazareth apparently had little influence with a Bethlehem innkeeper. On the other hand, Joseph of Arimathea must have possessed considerable influence with the mighty Pilate or else his gold was persuasive. Did that Christmas Joseph assist Mary as she wrapped her first-born in swathing bands, very probably? And for the Good Friday Joseph, the task would be similar, but very different – not swaddling clothes, but a winding sheet called a shroud. Aided by Nicodemus, who had brought an enormous quantity of perfumes and spices to anoint the body, the remains of Jesus were prepared for burial (John 19:40).

Both Josephs were obedient men, one to an angel (Matt. 1:24), and the other to his conscience (Jn. 19:38). The first obedient Joseph fades from history. Joseph of Nazareth is last heard of when Jesus at the age of twelve became a “son of the law”. The time of his death is not stated in the Gospels. Joseph of Arimathea comes slowly to a forefront in the public life of Jesus. This Good Friday Joseph moved from the life of Christ, to the cross on which He was hung, to the tomb in which Christ was buried. Joseph saw in the Christ of the cross a Messiah, hope for the forgiveness of sin. He knew that without the savior, we will die in our sin. This Joseph looked into the dying eyes of Jesus, and saw the reason for sacrifice. Jesus’ death and resurrection moved Joseph from the cross and the tomb to a new era of discipleship.

So do all, who see in the Christ of the cross their hope of forgiveness from sin. So do all, who in the power of the resurrected Christ; find that the barriers to a victorious spiritual life are rolled away. The Good Friday Joseph finds himself the Easter Joseph, newly alive in Christ, resurrected from an existence of sin, and now personally embodying the power he found in the resurrection.

The Christmas Joseph came to realize that Jesus was sent of God as he wrapped the babe in swaddling clothes. The Good Friday Joseph came to see that his wealth and prominent stature were worth risking realizing the untold riches of having your sins forgiven. Let Mt. Pleasant Methodist join in by becoming the resurrection church where our faith is lived out each day. And let us not take for granted the precious gift that God has placed within our reach, that of salvation for the sinner, even the sins committed by you and I.

From the Admin Board

Spring Greetings everyone! I hope this correspondence finds you all doing well. On March 20th we held our 2nd administrative board meeting of the year. We discussed a number of topics in this meeting. Our trustees reported that they have renewed our annual contract with our current lawn care company and that it will be staying at the same price. We are changing to a new pest control company named Bugout. They will be coming quarterly and treating the church grounds against termites, fire ants, and other pests.

I am happy to report that our Trustees have agreed to a deal with Helms Security who will be adding 9 security cameras throughout our property. This will require a one time payment of \$9,100. With this system we will have up to 1 month of review time for each camera. These cameras will be equipped with infrared and thermal technology as well as facial recognition software. We will also be adding signage around our parking lots that will state that this property is under 24 hour surveillance. This will be a great addition for our church.

Our Trustees also reported that they had recently filed a claim with our insurance company for possible storm damage to our roofs. During the assessment by the claims adjuster, it was learned our insurance coverage for the Old Church was dropped due to a small crack in one of the exterior walls. The Trustees are in the process of obtaining quotes for coverage on the building. As you can see our Trustees have been very busy so please take time to thank these individuals for all that they do!

I am also happy to announce that we will soon be introducing a new Mt. Pleasant Church logo. Pastor Byron and Pastor Kaleb have been working diligently with the graphic design group, Innovative Outfitters, to create a new logo. They presented several great options to our administrative board who then voted on one that they believed would be the best fit. This new logo incorporates some of our natural landscapes nearby which is very unique and thoughtful. This new logo will be added to our Church website and Facebook page and will help with future advertising for fundraisers and events happening here at Mt. Pleasant.

Our last piece of business that we discussed was for our continued need for a church van. We currently have \$2,500.00 allocated into our 2025 church budget for van use this year. Our Youth Group and Keenagers go on numerous outings throughout the year which requires us to rent a van each time to help accommodate these trips. For example, our Youth Group will be traveling to Western North Carolina in June for a mission trip to help assist those affected by Hurricane Helene and they will be renting a van for the week. This cost will be \$2,500.00 for a 1 week rental. If we had our own van our annual upkeep and

maintenance combined would be less than \$2,500.00. So far we have raised just over \$2,000 for a new van and our goal is to raise \$65,000. We would prefer to purchase a van with one payment and avoid having to take out a loan. In the long run having our own van would save us money that we could put to use towards other needs and missions. If you would like to help with this endeavor please mark your gift with "van fund".

In closing, I hope you all have a blessed and joyous Easter and may it be filled with hope and renewal!

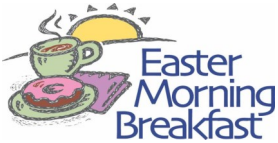

As I pen this article, we are midway into the season of Lent, my personal favorite time of the liturgical year. *Lent is a 40-day season of prayer and fasting that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Maundy Thursday. It is observed in recognition of Jesus Christ's fasting in the wilderness.* Because I am an introvert who likes to live inside my head a lot of the time, Lent gives me forty dedicated days to examine my spiritual life, where I acutely realize my sin and remember the sacrifice God provided, i.e. Jesus Christ, for the atonement of my sin. Ensemble rehearses Thursdays 6:45pm-7:45pm and sings for the 8:30am service. It is helpful to read music.
