Our Christian Symbolism

Every church sanctuary has its own unique features. Our sanctuary has some beautiful stain glass work that just pops with color as the sunlight shines through. There is a lot of Christian imagery in those windows. If you have never noticed stain glass work in our sanctuary and narthex, next time you are in our sanctuary, take some time to look up and see its beauty.

Years ago I used to serve as one of the pastors at Central Methodist Church in Asheboro, North Carolina. The sanctuary there at Central is beautifully decorated with Greek columns down each side and a 75-foot marble slab on the back chancel wall that contains an engraved gold cross surrounded by Greek symbols and letters.

One day, one of our newest members came up to me and we were talking about the symbolism within our sanctuary. As we talked he told me how he was interested in Christian symbolism and then he asked me this question. "Why are there two candles on the altar?" Now, I don't know if you have ever asked that same question or not, but in case you have, let me share with you what I told my friend.

The word symbolism, from the Greek *symballein*, means "to make a comparison." A symbol is a tangible object pointing to a spiritual and emotional truth.


In the deepest of human relationships, the wedding ring symbolizes the love and commitment of a man and a woman in holy matrimony. There are symbols in the general culture as well. The barber's striped pole is an example.

The Christian church's earliest symbols represented our Lord, most often as the Good Shepherd or the Lamb of God. Symbols may also be used to conceal truth. The sign of the fish quietly identified believers to each other in the presence of hostile elements.

The two altar candles symbolize the two natures of Jesus Christ: fully God yet fully man in one Person. When we gather for worship, the acolyte will light the altar candles to symbolize that Christ is the light of the world. (John 8:12)

After worship the acolyte will carry out the light, symbolizing that we are Christ's light and called to carry his message to the world. (Matthew 5:14-16) Having gathered for worship on the Lord's Day, we scatter to serve through the week. That's why starting in February, I am going to add the phrase at the bottom of our Sunday bulletins: "Worship has ended, let the service begin!", that's because after each week of having scattered; we gather again on the following Sunday. Such are the rhythms of the Christian walk. And wherever we are, we are the Church—the Body of Christ.

From the Admin Board

Season's Greetings everyone! I hope this correspondence finds you all well. On January 16th we held our first administrative board meeting of this new year. During this meeting we discussed our new budget for this year. We have allocated some funds into various accounts which will earn interest with various maturity, all of which will be FDIC insured.

Our Trustees reported that we have received a quote for \$37,000.00 to repair the awning at the side of the church that covers the office entry to the CLC entry. We are currently waiting for our insurance adjustment quotes before proceeding. The Trustees are also taking quotes for a new fence to go up around our playground. Our first quote for this project was \$17,000.00. We have also completed the first phase of renovations in the youth center and we approved to move forward with the next phase which will be adding a classroom in the front corner of the building. These renovations will be made by members of our church volunteering so please be sure to thank them for helping with this. In the near future we hope to update the bathrooms in the youth center as well. A motion was also made for us to install some type of security cameras throughout the church parking lot which was voted on and approved.

Last year we started the process of raising money to purchase a church van. In the long run having our own van would save our church time and money. Currently we are having to go through the process of renting a van every time we go on a trip with our youth group and our Keenagers. A van would also be useful for us when going on mission trips. These van rental prices do add up over time so it would be beneficial for us to have our own. If you would like to help with this endeavor please mark your gift with "van fund".

In closing, I hope that we all continue to keep our neighbors in western North Carolina who have been affected by Hurricane Helene in our thoughts and prayers. There are still ways to help out. If you would like to help please reach out to our church office. I hope that everyone's New Year is off to a great start!


