MPMC Music Ministry Happenings Dawn Broom

Thank you, Church Family, for having faith in me to lead the music ministry of our great church. I am thankful to share my experience and "wisdom" through music, an area where I believe God has gifted me somewhat. He is indeed good!

Now let me share with you some thoughts on one of my many ministry passions, i.e. congregational singing. In reality, inspiring you to sing as an expression of your worship of and praise for God on Sunday mornings, is indeed one of the many tasks of a Minister of Music. And I don't take it lightly. After all, it is biblical to sing praise to the Lord; the Psalms are filled with admonitions to do so, i.e.

Psalm 95:1: "Come, let us sing for joy to the Lord; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation."

Psalm 96:1: "Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth."

Psalm 100:2: "Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs."

Today, there is a married couple single-handedly reviving congregational hymn singing; it is Keith and Kristyn Getty. They are Irish and live here in the United States near Nashville. Over the last 5-7 years, they have hosted a conference called Sing!, where some of the current, noted writers and singers of hymn-based songs stand in a room filled with church musicians and sing to the glory of God for 3 consecutive days. It occurs around Labor Day, and there are Youtube videos of past Sing! Conferences for all of us to view. Here are some thoughts from Keith Getty about congregational singing:

"Just as home entertainment has morphed from family and neighborhood sing-alongs to the ability to consume whatever music the global professionals offer, the church has shifted away from an emphasis on corporate singing. At best, larger churches have shifted to more professional, performance-oriented music. And smaller churches have adopted less of the traditional "come one, come all" since, because it feels outdated, irrelevant, and at times downright embarrassing. Who

can compete with the masters, after all?

It seems our society's progress has played a role in the end of congregational singing. Right? Wrong. Congregational singing is far from dead, mainly because it's connected to a Source of Life higher than cultural trends or modern comparisons. Even so, it receives less attention and adulation than it should—and there are several reasons. First, people tend to be attracted to larger churches where the "performance" of music approximates the professional; in principle, there's nothing wrong with that. Second, the music in most churches tends to be so loud that the congregation simply cannot hear itself sing. Third, smaller churches with less ability to produce professional-sounding music tend to minimize singing altogether, so as to minimize embarrassment or perceived weakness.

But now is the moment to re-embrace the crucial role of congregational singing in our churches. Singing is an act of obedience; we gather and sing because we're called to do so like telling the truth, like loving our wives and our children, like loving our neighbor as ourselves. These may seem like bold statements but consider this: Singing is a real and tangible expression of loving the Lord with our whole hearts and our whole selves and loving our neighbor as ourselves.

Singing is also a privilege, a foretaste of heaven. After all, one day in the future, every tribe, language, nation, and people will sing as one congregation before the throne of the risen Lamb. Until then, we find a microcosm of that day in the unimpressive form of congregational worship. As we anticipate the matchless glories of heaven, there's immeasurable value in our singing together on earth."

My Friends, we should be grateful to sing. God graciously gives us the voices; He gives us the minds; He gives us the purpose. Shouldn't we all glorify Him in every way possible, including our singing?! As my column by-line, Soli Deo Gloria, says, "To God alone be the glory." Amen!

"Teach me Your way, Lord, so that I can walk in Your Truth. Make my heart focused only on honoring Your name." Psalm 86:11 (CEB)


