HOW DEEP IS THE SEA?

Micah 7:19



Do you remember in Titanic when Rose lets the Heart of the Ocean slip into the deep waters of the Atlantic? As it drifts slowly to the bottom, you know without being told that that the priceless jewel is gone forever, never to be found, never to be recovered. The ocean is far too immense, and the diamond — though of great value — is far too small. It's the same with your sins. When you bring them to God, he tosses them into the sea, where they sink to the bottom and disappear into the ocean floor, never to be seen again. **No matter what you think their price should be.** Still, we have a habit of diving after them, reliving the shame and feeling again the shame that sin has brought into our lives. Today we can celebrate God's forgiveness, deeper than the ocean, farther than the east is from the west, greater than our sin.

Greetings everyone! I hope this correspondence finds you all well. I have a couple of updates to share with you. First, I am pleased to share with you that we have now raised over \$15,000 for our church van fund. Our finance committee has currently placed that money into a 90-day CD which has an interest rate of 4.10%, so it will continue to grow. Our ultimate goal is to raise \$65,000 for a new van. We have placed a thermometer growth chart in the narthex so we can all keep up with where we stand financially with this endeavor each week. If you would like to help with this please mark your gift with "van fund". Our trustees have also been working diligently to find new insurance coverage for the Old Church. Earlier this year we learned that our insurance coverage for the Old Church was dropped due to a small crack on one of the exterior walls. I have been informed that we should have new coverage soon.

We are also close to being finished with the renovations in our Youth Center. Pastor Kaleb has put together a list for the last few needed items for this project which will be shared with us in this newsletter. Lastly, we have completed the new infant nursery which is next to our existing nursery. We have added rocking chairs, cribs, and a changing station in this room and we will be adding some new artwork soon.

In closing, I hope that you all had a wonderful Easter and I hope that you all are enjoying these beautiful spring days!




