Recently we have changed our Sunday worship time. We've moved from two services back to one service at 10 AM. This idea was introduced by me, and after many conversations with staff and laity, and many prayers, it was approved by our Administrative Board. Some folks have asked, Why the change? Well...our two services were almost identical in content with some slight adjustments between them. Also, our worship space in each service has been half full, so lack of space for one service is not an issue. One advantage of going back to one service is that it allows our nursery workers and sound booth volunteers to better fulfill their responsibilities.

Since COVID, there have been more churches nation-wide leaving a multi-service worship format & going back to having one worship on Sundays. Thom Rainer, president and CEO of LifeWay Christian Resources, has observed six reasons some churches are moving back to one worship style. Take a look at his post from August 21, 2025:

You could not help but notice the trend of the past two decades. Numerous churches began offering worship services with different worship styles. It is not unusual to see a church post its times of worship for a contemporary worship service, a traditional worship service, and an occasional blended worship service.



The trend was fueled by two major factors. First, many churches were fighting worship wars. The great compromise was creating a worship service for each faction.

Unfortunately, that created divisiveness in some churches as each faction fought for its preferred time slot. Second, some churches had a genuine outreach motivation. Their leaders saw the opportunity to reach people in the community more effectively with a more indigenous worship style.

Though I am not ready to declare a clear reversal of the trend, I do see signs of a major shift. It is most noticeable among those congregations that have moved from multiple worship styles back to one worship style.

1. So I spoke to a number of pastors whose churches had made the shift back to a singular worship style. I asked about their motivations for leading their congregations in such a direction. I heard six recurring themes, though no one leader mentioned more than three for a particular church. Multiple worship styles created an "us versus them" mentality. Worship wars did not really end with multiple approaches. In some churches the conflicts were exacerbated because those of different preferences did not interact with each other.

- 2. *The church did not have the resources to do multiple styles with quality.* In many churches, inadequate resources meant one or all of the services suffered. It was deemed better to put all the resources toward one style of worship.
- 3. The church moved from multiple services to one service. I heard from a number of pastors who have led their churches back to just one service, a move that naturally necessitates one style. Some did so to engender a greater sense of community; others did so due to excessive space in the worship center.
- **4.** *The Millennial generation has influenced many churches.* This generation is much more flexible in its preferences of worship style. They are questioning the need of multiple styles.
- 5. Worship wars are waning. Many congregations with multiple worship styles created them as a response to worship wars. Now that the conflicts are waning in many churches, the need to segregate by worship preferences is no longer necessary.
- 6. Multiple generations are becoming more accustomed to different types of church music and worship style. Contemporary music, in some form, has been around a while. It is not this strange aberration it once was to many congregants. And many church members who did not grow up on traditional worship are hearing those hymns in new and meaningful ways. Simply stated, there is a much greater appreciation for different forms of church music than in the past. Again, I am reticent to declare a major trend to be taking place. But, anecdotally, I am seeing more congregations move to the singular worship style approach. In our worship here at Mt. Pleasant I want the Gospel to be proclaimed through the music we sing & the spoken Word. The Gospel of Jesus Christ unifies, it does not divide. We come to worship as one body to glorify God.

At Mt. Pleasant Methodist my goal as your pastor is to grow the fellowship. By having one worship service we not only better utilize our nursery, sound booth resources, and worship space; we also come together as a multi-generational community, just like the 1st century church used to do, to give all our praise and glory to Him. I believe that a one-service worship is ideal, because in one service you are: hearing one preached Word, sharing prayers, & taking the Lord's Supper all together. By coming together in worship, it will help us keep unity in the body and grow our church.

FROM PASTOR KALEB

Hello Church!

It's hard to believe that it's already October. It feels like we just celebrated Easter and Pentecost, and we heard the joyful laughter of kids in the sanctuary during our True North VBS. I have loved the family-friendly atmosphere here at Mt. Pleasant since my first Sunday. As Christians and members of Christ's holy Church, we often refer to the Church as a big family. There is a warm feeling associated with being part of a healthy church family, but as Christians, this family is constantly growing, and we are called to invite others to join the family of God. Evangelism and discipleship are two core components of a healthy church and healthy Christians. Faithful followers of Christ have a desire to share His love (evangelism) while also obeying His teachings (discipleship). In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus appears to Simon and Andrew while they are fishing. He then calls out to them, saying, "Come, follow me... and I will send you out to fish for people" (4:19). This is one instance in Scripture where Jesus is clear about what it means to be His follower. If we aren't fishing, then we aren't following. Notice the very next line in this passage: "At once they left their nets and followed him" (4:20). Talk about faithful obedience.

I believe with all my heart that Jesus wants His followers to take action. He wants His people to be producers, not just consumers. I'm not a fisherman, but I know that fishermen are quick to recommend good spots to catch fish. If you went fishing on Lake Norman and asked someone who's fished here all their life, they would probably suggest some excellent locations. They might even tell you what type of lure to use at those spots. I believe people need to encounter Jesus more than ever. Our country and culture are at a turning point. Friends, now is the time to fish for people. Now is the time to recommend Mt. Pleasant Methodist Church to someone. We recommend our favorite restaurant or movie to others. Let's fish for people by simply inviting them to come and see what the Lord is doing here at Mt. Pleasant. Recommendation is a simple form of evangelism. Sometimes, inviting a stranger to church can feel intimidating, so start with a simple recommendation! Like Simon and Andrew were obedient to Jesus' call, may we follow their example. May we leave our nets and follow Jesus by fishing for people.




Sunday, October 5


