In my readings, I came across this article that my friend Steve May wrote recently. I thought you would enjoy his insight, so I wanted to share it with you. – Pastor Byron

THE MORNING BY MORNING GOODNESS OF GOD

Many hymns were written in response to a dramatic turning point in the composer's life — a personal crisis, a lost love, the death of someone near.

But this hymn was not the result of a turning point as much as it is the result of a lifelong reflection. While many hymns are born out of a dramatic experience, this hymn was simply the result of the author's morning by morning recognition of God's faithfulness.



The story begins in 1893, in the southern state of Kentucky. A young newspaper editor named Thomas Obadiah Chisholm surrendered his life to Jesus Christ. He was 27 at the time, and his dream became that someday he would serve God full time in the ministry.

Eventually he was able to serve as a pastor in the Methodist Church, but his appointment lasted only a year; he was forced to resign due to poor health. He then moved to New Jersey and began selling life insurance, while remaining active in his local church.

Over the years he wrote well over a thousand hymns and sacred poems, submitting them often to various periodicals for publication. A few made their way into print, though he himself never became well-known.

Later in life, at the age of 75, he wrote...

"My income has not been large at any time due to impaired health in the earlier years which has followed me until now, although I must not fail to record the unfailing faithfulness of a covenant-keeping God, for which I am filled with astonishing gratefulness."

Thomas Chisholm finally retired at the age of 87. He spent his last years in a retirement home. In 1960, at the age of 94, he went home to be with the Lord.

It was a song that he wrote years earlier, in 1923, at the age of 57, for which he is known today. If you've been in church very long, you no doubt know it. It was written by a man who lived, by and large, an unremarkable life — knowing neither fame nor fortune. But he did know something about the day-by-day, morning-by-morning goodness of God in every area of life.

That's what makes this hymn great. Virtually every line of this great hymn is pulled from the Scripture. It reminds us of how the God we serve is faithful in every way — even when things don't work out exactly as we would like, we can see his hand at work in every moment of every day.

These are the words that Thomas Obadiah Chisholm wrote...

*Great is Thy faithfulness, O God my Father!
There is no shadow of turning with Thee;
Thou changest not, Thy compassions they fail not:
As Thou hast been Thou forever wilt be.*

And this is the chorus...

*Great is Thy faithfulness, great is Thy faithfulness,
Morning by morning new mercies I see;
All I have needed Thy hand hath provided
Great is Thy faithfulness, Lord, unto me!*



Thomas Obadiah Chisholm never achieved the accolades of success in this life. As a musician, you might call him a late-comer and a one-hit-wonder. But he lived a great life because he experienced, and he recognized, and he appreciated the morning-by-morning faithfulness of God in his life.

A lesson we can learn from his life: **When you make it your habit to seek God's presence every day, you begin to see evidence of his faithfulness all around you.**

MPMC Music Ministry Happenings Dawn Broom

Thank you, Church Family, for your unending support of our music ministry. The month of August was a great time of worship where both congregations combined

and sang some of the old songs from the Cokesbury Hymnal.

The depth of theological truth in those “old” songs is profound. So glad we had that opportunity.

In September, we launch into our “new” year with music rehearsals beginning the week of Labor Day:

Wednesday, September 3

6:30pm – Bells of Praise (Handbell Room)

7:10pm – Chancel Choir (Choir Room)

Sunday, September 7

4:00pm – Children’s Choir (CLC)

Continuing on with thoughts from contemporary Irish hymnwriters, Keith & Kristyn Getty. Here is a little of an interview with Baptist Press (edited by me).

BP: “What distinguishes a hymn?”

Keith: “There’s no scientific answer. If you go to England, they will tell you that hymns are songs in the English tradition of hymn writing, and something like *Just a Closer Walk with Thee* or *I Come to the Garden* or *Because He Lives* are Gospel songs, and modern worship songs are worship songs. If you go to America, everything written before 1980, for the most part, is called a hymn, and everything written after 1980 suddenly is a worship song. Thus, everybody has a different definition of it. Because some songs have an artistry that is slightly more timeless and slightly stronger, I gravitate to calling them hymns. And I think there is something to be said for valuing the heritage we have. It seems a curious arrogance to me that some musicians only want to sing songs that are contemporary; I say that to myself as well, because I am a writer and I want to use my own songs.”

BP: So you see that we lose something when we don’t sing hymns?

Keith: “Yes, I think that, sometimes, we don’t listen to those who have gone before us, and we don’t have a sense of understanding the past ...”

Kristyn: “And we don’t acknowledge that we’re part of something greater than ourselves. People have been

creating music and art for generations. We can’t assume we operate in a vacuum and are not connected to anything but ourselves. Singing hymns and recognizing the past helps us be better; it helps us not be arrogant in how we consider ourselves.

It also helps us be mindful of what it is we’re passing on to the next generation of people.”

BP: When you’re writing a hymn, what is the goal?

Keith: “To write a piece of art that somehow helps a congregation of people be illuminated by the character of God and respond to it in a song. In many instances, for congregational worship, you’re writing for an artist, and that artist is singing to an audience. Then, in other instances, for congregational worship, **the artist is the congregation and the audience is God.**”

BP: What role do hymns play in teaching theology?

Keith: “We learn through many different things.

Scripture is ‘a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path,’ and 20% of it is poetry. So, immediately, you have to look at it and ask, ‘On what levels do we learn?’ If you’re asking us should hymns be used as expositional Bible teaching? No, they shouldn’t be. They’re pieces of art. A song with great lyrics and a bad melody is an awful song. It is a piece of art like poetry is a piece of art. It’s creating a picture; it’s creating an illustration. **The point is your soul and your emotions are engaged with others around you to sing.**”

Kristyn: “And no song can tell the whole story. We try to structure a song in such a way that it tells a story or carries a thought in some sort of coherent pattern through a song, as opposed to several different phrases put together that are all true, and of course, you can sing them in that way.”

Therefore, I continue to encourage you to sing when we experience corporate worship together each week. I truly believe it will strengthen your faith and draw you closer to the Lord. **Let it be that we all strive to experience worship more deeply by lifting our voices in song when we worship together each week.**

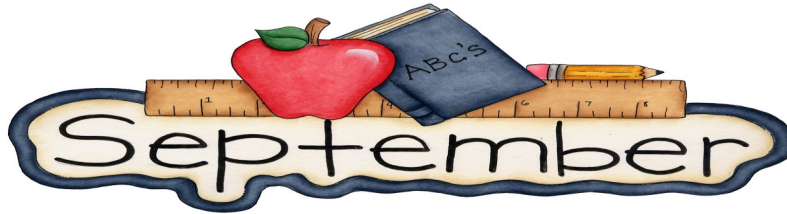
