## The Methodist Class Meeting: The Heart of the Methodist Revival Movement



I absolutely love the history of American Methodism—especially the First Great Awakening, which took place from 1730 to 1740. Jonathan Edwards, George Whitfield, and John Wesley were known for their powerful preaching. The amazing part is that they converted people outside the church's walls who had never heard the gospel before. Thousands of people were converted to the Christian faith by the preaching of John Wesley and George Whitfield. The First Great Awakening was largely due to George Whitefield's outdoor preaching. Many scholars consider Whitefield the more dynamic preacher and believe he likely saw more

immediate converts than Wesley. Yet today we speak of the Wesleyan tradition, not the Whitefield tradition. Why? One way to explain why the Wesleyan tradition took hold and remains one of the prominent Protestant traditions in America today is Wesley's emphasis on small-group formation. John Wesley became known for his intense discipleship methods, which led other Christians to call them "Methodists" because of their methods. One of Wesley's best methods is known as the "Class Meeting". This was the premier Wesleyan small group, where 8-12 people of mixed gender and ages gathered weekly to "watch over one another in love." In 1776, Methodists made up 2% of religious adherents in the colonies; by 1850, Methodists comprised 34.5% of religious adherents in the United States. Throughout this period of extreme growth, every Methodist was expected to attend a weekly class meeting. The argument can be made that Wesleyan Class Meetings played a vital role in the growth not only of Methodism but also of American Christianity during the early stages of our nation's history.

I lament that the class meeting has become a lost art in Methodism today. However, I celebrate that many churches in the Global Methodist Church are seeking to revive this part of our history. I wonder what God might do through contemporary Methodism, including Mt. Pleasant Methodist Church, if we seek to revive this holy small group practice. What if every member of Mt. Pleasant committed to attending a weekly small-group gathering to watch over their brother/sister in Christ with holy love? What if we sought to love God & love our neighbor in Christian fellowship? We would get to know the struggles and successes of those sitting across from us on Sunday morning. Maybe God has a third great awakening in store for this nation. Maybe it starts with the recovery of the Methodist class meeting. Friends, there is more to come on this, but I invite you to begin celebrating our history and begin praying for a revival of holy love through small groups within Mt. Pleasant Methodist Church.

MPMC Music Ministry Happenings

Thank you, Church Family for your unending support and encouragement of Mount Pleasant Methodist's music ministry. I continue with another installment of the article, "Why singing is surprisingly good for your health."

## Good vibrations

*Singing also produces other measurable physical effects. It has been found to improve people's heart rate and blood pressure. Singing in groups or choirs has even been found to boost our immune function in ways that simply listening to the same music cannot. There are different explanations for this. From a biological standpoint, it's thought that singing activates the vagus nerve which is directly connected to the vocal cords and muscles in the back of the throat. The prolonged and controlled exhalation involved in singing also releases endorphins associated with pleasure, well-being, and the suppression of pain.*

*Singing also activates a broad network of neurons on both sides of our brain, causing regions that deal with language, movement, and emotion to light up. This, combined with the focus on breathing singing requires, make it an effective stress reliever. "The 'feel good' responses become clear in the brighter sounding voices, facial expressions, and postures."*

*There could be some deep-rooted reasons for these benefits too. Some anthropologists believe that our hominid ancestors sang before they could speak, using vocalizations to mimic the sounds of nature or express feelings. This may have played a key role in the development of complex social dynamics, emotional expression, and ritual, and it's no accident that singing is part of every human's life, whether musically inclined or not, noting that our brains and bodies are attuned from birth to respond in positive ways to song. "Lullabies are sung to children, and then songs are sung at funerals." We learn our times tables through chanting, and our ABCs through rhythmic and melodic structure."*

As we travel through the Lenten season, I encourage you to sing along on the hymns in worship. Singing not

only focuses your mind on the God Who created us, it readies your heart to hear Him speak to you. He made us to sing. Why not experience more fulfilling and rewarding worship by thoughtfully singing in worship?

**Preschool enrollment will open to the public this month.** Some of the classes are already full with a waitlist. Application **and** registration fees are required to guarantee their child a spot for the upcoming year. The registration fee is \$75.00. We encourage parents to take advantage of early registration and save \$25.00. This fee will increase to \$100.00 after June 30<sup>th</sup>. We would like to thank **Sherrills Ford Pediatric Dentistry** for coming to the preschool and discussing proper dental hygiene with the children last month.

We will be celebrating **Dr Seuss's birthday the week of March 2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup>**. The children will be able to dress each day as follows:

Parents will need to pick their child up from preschool by 11:30 am whether they plan to attend the event or not. The staff will be helping during this event and will not be responsible for their child.

Everyone should plan to bring lunch for themselves and their child. We will eat around 12:15 pm. It is suggested that they bring chairs and/or blanket to use if needed.

The shelter is reserved until 1:30 pm, but everyone is welcome to stay and play on the playground.

We are now registering for **Summer Preschool**. We have classes in June, July, and August. **The Program is offered to children ages 2 – 5. We also have a class for K-2<sup>nd</sup> grade.** This is for those **FINISHING kindergarten – second grade**. Classes are Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday's. This will allow parents and staff to plan long weekend vacations. The early registration fee will be \$45.00 which is due by May 1<sup>st</sup>. After May 1<sup>st</sup>, the registration fee will increase to \$55.00. This fee reserves your child a spot in our Summer Program and helps with the cost of supplies needed. A copy of the summer dates are listed. Parents will have the option of choosing which week's work is best for their schedule. The cost is \$70.00 a week. If they choose to send their child each week, they will receive a \$10 discount for that month. The payment is due on the first day that their child attends preschool each month. We look forward to another fun summer at Mt Pleasant!

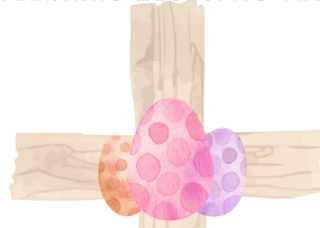

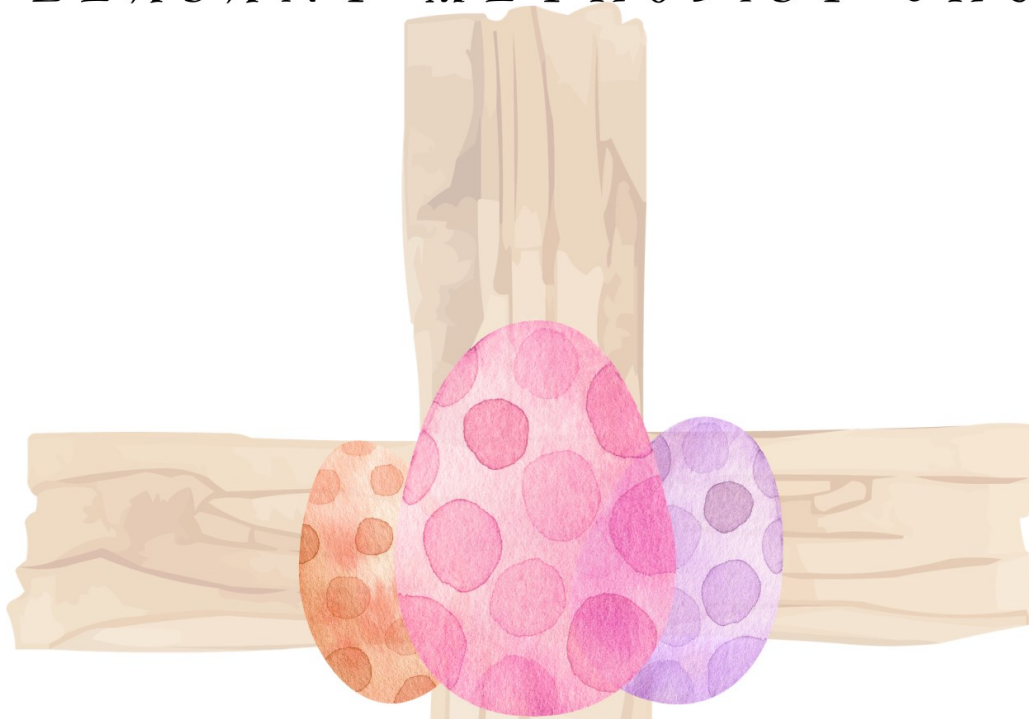
