



# STEWARDSHIP OF TIME

The stewardship of time refers to the conscious and prayerful use of the hours and moments God has given us. It involves recognizing time as a precious gift and using it wisely to grow in faith, serve others, and fulfill God's will in our lives. This stewardship calls us to prioritize activities that foster our spiritual growth, such as prayer, attending Mass, reading Scripture, and participating in the Sacraments. It also extends to how we use our time in serving our families, communities, and those in need. By managing our time with intention and purpose, we honor God and contribute to the building of His Kingdom on Earth.

### Consider These Ideas to Help You Get Started:

- Daily Prayer and Reflection: Set aside specific times each day for prayer, meditation, or reading Scripture to deepen your relationship with God.
- Attend Mass Regularly: Make a commitment to attend Mass not just on Sundays, but also on weekdays or special feast days when possible.
- · Volunteer in Your Parish: Offer your time to serve in ministries at
- St. Michael, whether through teaching, assisting with liturgies, or helping with community events.
- Family Prayer Time: Dedicate time each day to pray together as a family, fostering spiritual growth and unity.
- Spiritual Reading: Spend time reading Catholic books, articles, or devotionals that nourish your faith and provide spiritual insights.

# STEWARDSHIP OF TALENT

The stewardship of talent refers to the recognition and use of the unique gifts and abilities that God has given to each person. It involves discerning how these talents can be used not only for personal fulfillment but also for the glory of God and the service of others. The Church teaches that our talents are entrusted to us by God to build up the Church and to advance His Kingdom on Earth. The faithful are called to develop and share their talents generously, fostering a spirit of gratitude and humility. By using our talents in ways that reflect God's love and purpose, we fulfill our role as co-creators with Him and as stewards of His gifts.

#### Pray About the Following:

- Discernment of Talents: Pray for the wisdom to recognize and understand the unique gifts God has given you, asking for clarity in how to best use them for His glory.
- Strength and Courage: Ask for the strength and courage to step out of your comfort zone and use your talents, especially in areas where you may feel uncertain or challenged.
- Humility and Gratitude: Pray for a heart of humility and gratitude, acknowledging that your talents are gifts from God and should be used for His purposes rather than personal recognition.
- Inspiration and Creativity: Ask God to inspire and energize your creativity, helping you to find new and meaningful ways to use your talents in service of the Church and the world.

# STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE

The stewardship of treasure involves responsibly managing and generously sharing the material and financial resources God has entrusted to us. Recognizing all we have as gifts from God, we are called to support the Church, care for those in need, and further God's work on Earth through tithes, offerings, and charitable giving. This practice reflects our faith and trust in God, acknowledging that our true wealth is found in our relationship with Him.

Why Give a Percentage of Income?

We give the tithe (which means 10% of one's harvest or income) because it is a scriptural benchmark that has been honored since the early Church (see Malachi 3:10).

At St. Michael, we suggest breaking down the tithe in the following way:

5% to the Parish Offertory

1% to the Archdiocese

4% to other charities for a total of 10%

Working Toward Giving the Tithe

If reaching the goal of tithing is challenging, consider gradually increasing your giving by one or two percent of your income each year. With time, you'll find that tithing becomes an achievable goal. More importantly, you'll be confident that you've been faithful in putting God first, even in your finances.

### Liturgical Ministries

All Liturgical Ministers (except Altar Servers) must be confirmed Catholics and, if married must be in accordance with the laws of the Church. Schedules are on a rotating basis.

### **Altar Server:**

Altar servers assist the priest at Mass and help to make the liturgy more beautiful. Parish children who have received First Communion and are in fifth through 12th grade may serve at Mass.



### Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion:

This ministry provides the opportunity to share the Body and Blood of Christ at Mass, as well as with those who are unable to attend Mass (homebound, hospital, nursing home).

#### **Music Ministries:**

Music ministers are called to lead and enter into song with the congregation, glorifying God through music. There are several ways one can join the Music Ministry:

#### Cantor:

Cantors will feel comfortable singing before a congregation by him/herself with an accompanist. Cantors are scheduled on a rotating basis.

#### Choir:

Choir members should feel comfortable singing in a group before the congregation. The choir sings on a rotating basis.

### Accompanists/ Instrumentalists:

Accompanists are important in leading and sustaining the music for the congregation. Instrumentalists add to the music and elevate worship. Instrumentalists, pianists, and organists who would like to serve are encouraged to contact us.

#### Schola:

The St. Michael Schola is an auditioned group which specializes in chant and polyphony. The Schola sings at various liturgies throughout the year. This group requires learning difficult music by oneself; ability to read music is highly recommended.

#### Reader:

Readers proclaim the Word of God in Sacred Scripture during Mass. There is an established schedule for each weekend Mass and signups occur throughout the year for extra Masses.

#### Sacristan:

Sacristans arrive before Mass to prepare the altar and ensure that other ministers are present.

#### **Usher:**

Ushers assist at Mass by helping parishioners find a pew to sit in, circulating the collection baskets during the Offertory, guiding the gift bearers who bring up the gifts, and assisting in the flow of traffic during Communion. This ministry is open to anyone in high school or older.

### **Adult Bible Studies:**

The parish offers two adult Bible studies: Beginner's Bible Study and Thursday Bible Study. Beginner's Bible Study meets Sunday morning 9:30-10:45 a.m. Thursday Bible Study meets Thursday morning 10-11:30 a.m. They are both taught by graduates of the Guadalupe Bible College.




### **Monthly Rosary Group:**


