Annual Meeting -A Celebration of Libraries

The Broward Public Library Foundation Board of Directors marked its 43rd annual meeting on Oct. 8 with, in Chair Joey Crawford's words, "a celebration of possibility...of what happens when stories, ideas, and people come together to build something extraordinary."

He discussed the Foundation Board's mission this year: Leading Through Advocacy. "Advocacy ensures," he noted, "that amid the noise of political uncertainty, the voice of libraries remains strong, clear, and unified."

In addition to Crawford, the Board's 2025-2026 officers are Vice Chair, Diana Verity of J.P. Morgan; Secretary, Monique Blake of Broward College; and Treasurer, Henny Shomar of Tripp Scott.

The Board unanimously voted to install new members Soni Laing, Ryder System, Inc.'s Senior Director of Brand Strategy and Advertising, and Allison Rials, who will serve as an ex-officio Board member, representing the Library Advisory Board. Gregg Goldstein, of EM Consulting Group, who joined the Board in September, was also recognized.

Nancy Thies, the Community Foundation of Broward's Philanthropic Services Executive, presented details of its new report on philanthropy in Broward, "Unlocking Possibilities."

Dr. Neile taught storytelling studies for two decades at Florida Atlantic University and has shared her work in seven countries and thirteen states. Her latest book, Featuring Florida, explores the state's identity through TV, movies, and fiction from the 19th century to today. Her upcoming title, Florida Funny, will be published later in 2026.
