

The Baptism of the Lord (January 11)

Many of the incidents which accompanied Christ's baptism prefigure what took place at our baptism. At Christ's baptism, the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our baptism, the Trinity took up residence in our soul. At His baptism, Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our baptism, we become the adopted sons of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our baptism, we are called to pray as He did.

May you continue to live out your mission as a follower of Jesus and as a son and daughter of God, our loving Abba Our Father!

There is something deeply beautiful about watching a parent and child work side by side—sharing a vision, a mission, even a trade. Over time, the child does not merely imitate the parent but comes to embody the same purpose, carrying the work forward with new energy and faithfulness. What we see so naturally in family life reveals something profoundly supernatural in the life of faith.

Jesus came among us to continue the mission of His Abba-Father. Everything He did flowed from this relationship of love. His words, His healings, His compassion for the poor and the sinner—all were expressions of the Father’s heart made visible in human flesh. Jesus’ entire life was about helping people recognize that God was not distant, not absent, but active and present in their lives.

At His Baptism in the Jordan, Jesus publicly embraced this mission. He did not need baptism for forgiveness—He was without sin. Rather, His Baptism was a moment of revelation and commissioning. The heavens opened. The Spirit descended like a dove, gentle yet powerful. The Father’s voice was heard: “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.” In this single moment, the mystery of the Trinity was revealed, and Jesus was manifested as the Beloved Son, the Anointed One—the Christ.

This feast marks a turning point. Jesus steps out of the hidden life of Nazareth and into His public ministry. Carpenter becomes preacher. Worker becomes Servant. Son becomes Savior. And with this moment, the Christmas and Epiphany season reaches its fulfillment, as Ordinary Time begins—reminding us that God is revealed not only in extraordinary moments, but in the ordinary rhythm of daily life.

Yet today’s feast is not only about Jesus. It is also about us.

Through Baptism, we are plunged—immersed—into the very life and mission of Christ. What was revealed in Jesus is shared with us by grace. We become adopted sons and daughters of the Father. The same Spirit rests upon us. We are incorporated into Christ and entrusted with His mission. Baptism does not simply cleanse; it commissions. It does not only remove sin; it creates a new person, a new creation, destined for heaven and marked forever with God’s seal.

In Baptism, we share in Christ’s threefold mission as Priest, Prophet, and King.

As priests, we are called to sanctify the world. This happens not primarily at an altar, but in everyday life—through prayer for others, quiet sacrifices, acts of love, forgiveness, fidelity, and service. Every sacrifice offered in love becomes a *sacra-ficium*—a holy act—through which God’s grace reaches others.

As prophets, we are called to speak for God—not only with words, but with our lives. People should be able to glimpse God’s mercy, truth, and compassion in how we listen, how we treat others, how we respond to suffering and injustice. This calling is not always easy. True prophets are often misunderstood or rejected. But we remember: some people may never read the Gospel unless they first read it written in us.

As kings, we are called to lead—not by power or control, but by service. Jesus reigns from the Cross and kneels to wash feet. We share in His kingship when we serve generously, lead humbly, and place the needs of others before our own. This is the paradox of Christian royalty: we reign by loving.

Today, as we reflect on the Baptism of the Lord, we are invited to remember our own baptism—not as a distant memory, but as a living reality. We are not spectators of Christ’s mission; we are participants. We are not merely members of the Church; we are co-workers in the vineyard of the Lord.

This is both a gift and a responsibility.

So let us ask ourselves:

- How consciously do I live as a baptized son or daughter of God?
- How am I helping others grow in holiness?
- How does my life proclaim the Good News?
- Where is God calling me to serve more generously?

At the Jordan, Jesus revealed who He is. Through Baptism, He reveals who we are—and who we are called to become. May we live each day immersed in His life, faithful to His mission, and confident that the Father looks upon us and says, “You are my beloved.”

The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. "In the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth and under the earth" (Phil 2:10). Christ's name is chosen in heaven, and the Angel Gabriel reveals it when he announces: "Behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb and shalt bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus." The name itself means, "savior." It is in Jesus' name that we pray to the Father with assurance of being heard. In His name the Church administers all sacraments, offers prayers and blesses homes, the fields, and the sick. In the name of Jesus, evil spirits are cast out, and the Church assures us that whoever calls upon Jesus' name will be saved. Finally, at the end of our earthly lives, it is in Jesus' name that Church asks "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord."

A sacrament is an outward sign of a grace that God gives us in our soul. When we are baptized, water is poured on our head as a symbol of the sin being washed out of our soul.




