St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr for the Faith: Patron of Candlemakers and Those With Throat Ailments

St. Blaise was the Bishop of Sabaste in Armenia (modern-day Sivas, Turkey). He is believed to have suffered martyrdom in the persecution of Licinius in the early 4th century, about the year 316.

It is said that one day, a woman rushed her only son, who was choking on a fish bone, to St. Blaise. The saint blessed the boy, and the fishbone was immediately dislodged. Another time, a destitute widow told St. Blaise that a wolf had carried off a small pig, her only possession. The saint told her, "Do not weep, your pig will be returned to you." To the astonishment of everyone, the wolf came running back and returned his prey unharmed.

Arrested for professing the True Faith, St. Blaise was tortured and imprisoned. It is said that the woman whose pig had been returned brought two fine wax candles to dispel the gloom of St. Blaise's dark cell.

Steadfastly refusing to renounce the Faith, St. Blaise had his skin torn with wool-carding combs and was ultimately beheaded.

The story of St. Blaise shows us that the saints are concerned about such mundane aspects of our lives as sore throats! Their concern is a reflection of God's own love for us.

Grounded in God: The Strength of True Humility

May you continue to reflect on God's action in your life, and may that reflection move you—quietly, courageously—to reach out to others and share the Good News of God's love.

For many of us, humility has been misunderstood. When we were younger, it was easy to confuse humility with humiliation—to think that being humble meant shrinking ourselves, becoming invisible, or allowing others to walk all over us. But that is not the humility revealed in Scripture, nor the humility lived by the saints.

Yes, both humility and humiliation come from the Latin *humus*, meaning earth or ground. But humility does not mean thinking of ourselves as “just dirt.” It means being grounded—rooted firmly in God. True humility is not thinking less of ourselves; it is thinking of ourselves less often, because our lives are anchored in Christ.

Authentic humility is active, not passive. It does not silence our gifts; it places them at the service of others. We act, we serve, we speak, we lead—not for self-glory, but because we know everything we are and have has first been given by God.

Mary: Humble and Strong

Mary is the living icon of this humility. In the Magnificat (Luke 1:46–55), she does not deny what God has done in her. She proclaims it boldly—but she gives God all the glory. She is lowly, yet fearless. Humble, yet decisive. Grounded, yet lifted up. Her humility becomes the doorway through which salvation enters the world.

The Anawim: God's Chosen Poor

Today's Scriptures point us again and again to the Anawim—the poor, the lowly, the “bent-over ones.” Zephaniah urges us to seek the Lord, seek humility. The psalm reminds us that God listens closely to the lowly. St. Paul tells the Corinthians that God often chooses what the world overlooks: the weak, the forgotten, the humble—so that no one may boast except in the Lord.

Humility begins with truth: I need God. Not because I am useless—but because I am loved.

Jesus, the New Moses

In the Gospel, Jesus ascends the mountain and sits down—the posture of a teacher with authority. St. Matthew presents Him as the New Moses, but greater still: God speaking face to face with His people. Moses delivered ten commandments; Jesus gives us nine Beatitudes—not rules to obey, but a way of life to become.

And He begins where everything begins: “Blessed are the poor in spirit.”

Humility—poverty of spirit—is the foundation of every other Beatitude. Without it, mercy becomes pride, justice becomes ideology, and sacrifice becomes self-display. With it, everything becomes grace.

Humble... and Active

The first Beatitudes describe the Anawim: the poor, the meek, the sorrowing, the hungry. They trust God even when life is heavy. The next Beatitudes show what humility does: it shows mercy, seeks peace, works for justice, and endures suffering for the Gospel.

True humility does not say, “I'm no good.” True humility says, “God is good—and He can work through me.” It empowers us to speak carefully, act responsibly, serve generously, and suffer willingly if it leads others to God.

Living the Beatitudes Today

Humility shapes how we live right now:

- how we speak to others
- how we use our gifts
- how we respond to hardship
- how we rejoice with the joyful and walk with the wounded

Not because a rule demands it—but because love compels it.

A Question for the Heart

How have I understood humility until now?

Do I see it as weakness—or as being grounded in God's love and strength?

How can I more humbly—and more boldly—give witness to the Gospel through my service of others?

Jesus began His great sermon with humility because He wants it to shape our hearts first. He has given us everything we need for the journey to Heaven—grace, mercy, and a roadmap. That road begins low to the ground... but it leads straight into the Kingdom of God.

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Feb. 2)

This feast, observed forty days after Christmas, marks the day that Mary and Joseph would have brought Jesus to the Temple. We are called to participate in this feast in two ways. First, although each of us is unworthy of entering the God's Temple in Heaven, we are invited to enter it in union with Mary, our Blessed Mother. Second, as St. Joseph brought the Child Jesus to the temple priest who would offer Him to the Father, he also presents all of us who strive to live in union with Jesus. By these means, we hope that, like Simeon and Anna, others will behold Christ in us.

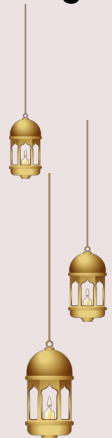

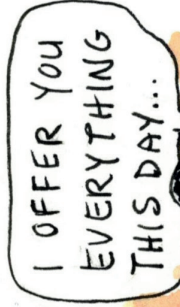

HE BECAME AN EXCELLENT PREACHER. SOON THE EMPEROR BECAME SUSPICIOUS OF THE CHRISTIANS.

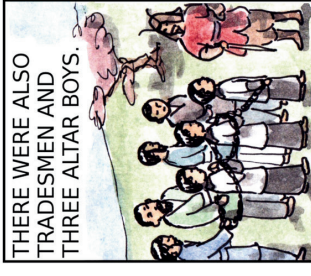

ALL OF THEM WERE TIED AND CHAINED TO CROSSES ON A HILL NEAR NAGASAKI.



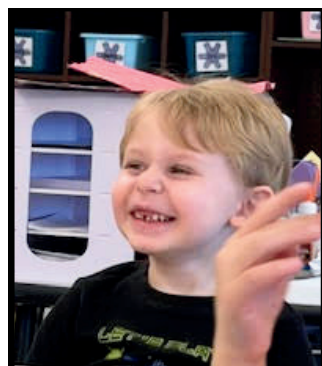
