


Salt, Light, and the Goodness That Must Be Brought Forth

Life can feel dull at times. Other times, it can feel heavy—almost oppressive. There are moments when the days blur together, when burdens weigh us down, and when hope feels distant. What keeps us going in those moments is often not a solution, but a person—someone who brings encouragement, who helps us breathe again, who reminds us that goodness still exists.

The truth is, the Goodness of God is always present. God has never abandoned us. Yet we often fail to see it, to taste it, to recognize it—especially when life feels dark or flavorless. That goodness does not disappear, but it often needs to be drawn out, illuminated, and enhanced. And this is where discipleship becomes real.

We need others to shine light into our situations—people who help us see what God is doing when our vision is blurred by fear or fatigue. We need others to bring out the flavor of what is still good in us when we feel flat or discouraged. But just as importantly, we are called to be that light and that flavor for others. As disciples of the Lord Jesus, we bear responsibility not only to receive hope, but to become hope.

Light in the Midst of Disappointment: The theme of light runs powerfully through today's readings. Yet the emphasis is not primarily on Jesus as the Light of the world—though He is—but on our call to reflect His light.

In the First Reading, the people of Israel have returned from Babylonian exile. They are finally home. They resume worship, fasting, and ritual. And yet they are deeply disappointed. They feel God has not responded. Their prayers seem unanswered. God speaks clearly through the prophet: It is not ritual alone that I desire.

God is not impressed by ceremonies divorced from compassion. What God longs for is mercy lived out—feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, caring for the poor and outcast, the Anawim. This, God says, is what brings light. This is what restores favor. This is what allows the dawn to break. True worship always spills outward into love.

Good Deeds That Shine: The Responsorial Psalm echoes this truth: Light rises in the darkness for those who are gracious and merciful. Those who give generously to the poor walk in God's light. Goodness is never meant to be hoarded. When goodness is shared, it multiplies—and it shines.

The Power of the Cross, Not Performance: In the Second Reading, St. Paul strips away any illusion that discipleship is about being impressive. He refuses eloquence. He rejects clever arguments. Instead, he preaches Christ crucified—a message the world calls foolish. Paul places his trust not in persuasive speech, but in the power of God revealed in self-giving love. The Cross becomes the ultimate act of light in darkness, hope in despair, and love poured out for the poor, the forgotten, and the broken.

Salt and Light: Our Identity, Not an Option: In the Gospel, Jesus speaks directly to His disciples—disciplined learners, including us. You are the salt of the earth. You are the light of the world. Salt preserves what is good. It keeps life from decaying. Salt enhances flavor, making food worth tasting again. Historically, salt was also used for healing. So too, disciples are called to:

- Preserve goodness when others feel like they're falling apart
- Restore flavor to lives that have gone flat
- Bring healing to those suffering physically, emotionally, financially, or spiritually

Jesus' warning is sobering: salt that loses its purpose is thrown away. Discipleship that never touches the lives of others is empty. Then Jesus speaks of light. Light exposes darkness. Light gives direction. Light brings warmth and hope. Those pushed to the margins—those burdened by storms of life—often live in darkness. They are precisely the ones Jesus asks us to illuminate.

One Light at a Time: This can feel overwhelming. There is so much suffering. We may grow cautious or cynical. We may question motives. We may wonder whether our efforts even matter. But Jesus never asked us to save the world alone. If each of us becomes salt and light for one person, or supports one organization, or commits to one act of mercy—then the darkness lessens. One flicker of light leads to another. And as we give light, we discover we receive more light ourselves. We see this every day: people responding to fires, floods, illness, poverty, tragedy. Love moves hearts to action. God's light spreads through people who choose compassion.

Called to Action: This is what God desires—not admiration for beautiful words, but lives poured out in love. Our God entered our suffering in Jesus Christ, the Crucified One. When we reach out in His name, the power of God is revealed. To be a disciple is to imitate the Master—to give of ourselves so others may experience the preserving, healing, enlightening presence of God.

Personal Questions for Prayer and Action: • How have I been salt to others—preserving what is good in their lives, enhancing their hope, offering healing? • How have I been light to those experiencing darkness? • What more can I do today? • This week, who is God asking me to serve so that His Goodness may shine? May we never underestimate the power of even one act of mercy. In Christ, light always overcomes darkness.




