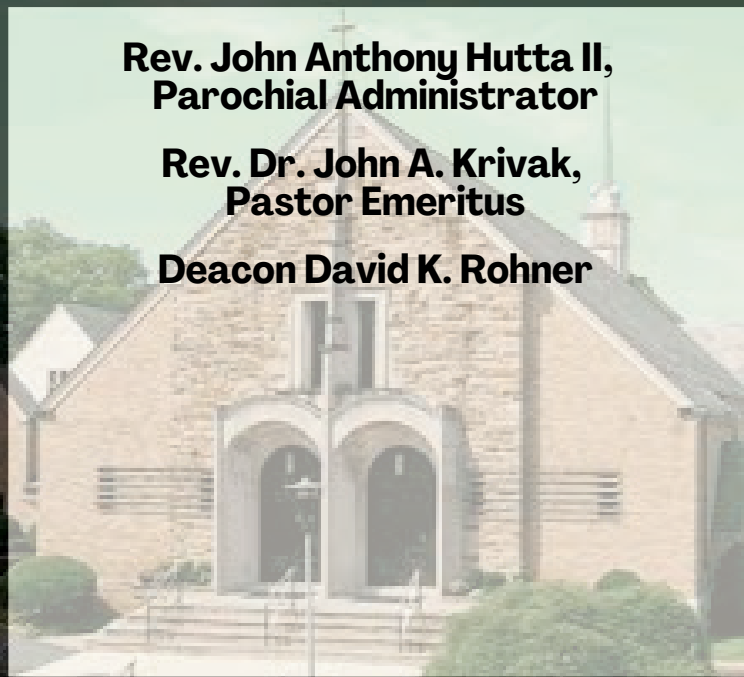

**Feast of St. Joseph the Worker, May 1** - As a carpenter, St. Joseph worked very hard. His manual labor was difficult, and he is a great example to all of us in our daily work. To foster devotion to St. Joseph, and in response to the Communist "May Day" celebrations for workers, Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of St. Joseph the Worker in 1955.

Scripture tells us: "The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to till it and keep it" (Genesis 2:15). Human work is a participation in the creative work of God. St. Joseph models for us the holiness of labor. St. Joseph did not work to get rich. He was not a servant of the state. He was not an oppressed laborer who needed liberating. He was a family man who found dignity in work as he humbly provided for his family.

On this **Good Shepherd Sunday**, we fix our eyes on Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd, whose voice still echoes through the heart of the Church: "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19). That call is not a distant echo from the Gospel past. It is living, active, and urgent today. Here in the Diocese of Allentown, as we celebrate the 65th Anniversary of our Diocese, we do so with grateful hearts and with a renewed spirit, asking the Lord to raise up generous souls who will answer His call to the priesthood and consecrated life. The voice of the Shepherd is still heard in our parishes, still present in our pews, still stirring within the hearts of our young people. The Lord continues to say, "Follow me." And from that invitation, vocations are born.



The Church is more than a place where we gather. She is a living communion where the voice of God can be heard. In the parish, through the beauty of the Sacraments, the proclamation of the Word of God, the witness of joyful priests, consecrated religious, and faithful parishioners, hearts are awakened to something greater. Young people begin to see not only what a priest or religious does, but who they are called to become: men and women set apart for Christ, configured to Him, and sent to serve His people with love. At the same time, vocations are not nurtured by the parish alone. They are cultivated in the quiet faith of families, strengthened by faithful friendships, and encouraged by communities that live the Gospel with joy. A parent who prays. A priest who invites. A mentor who encourages. A parish that believes in the beauty of surrendering one's life to God. All of these help create the fertile soil where vocations can take root and flourish.

As part of this 65th Anniversary year of the Diocese, I will also be implementing a prayer before Mass so that we may open our hearts more deeply to the Lord and intentionally ask Him to renew our Diocese with a spirit that fosters and cultivates vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. This will be a simple but powerful way for us, as a diocesan and parish family, to unite in prayer and to invite the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into His vineyard. On this Good Shepherd Sunday, we are reminded that every vocation begins with listening. The question is not only, "Whom is God calling?" but also, "Are we helping one another hear His voice?"

Let us pray earnestly for vocations in the Diocese of Allentown. Let us encourage our young men and women to be open, courageous, and generous in responding to the Lord. And may we, as a Church family, renew our commitment to creating a culture where vocations are welcomed, supported, and allowed to flourish. For the Good Shepherd is still calling... and He still says to each of us: "Follow me."
