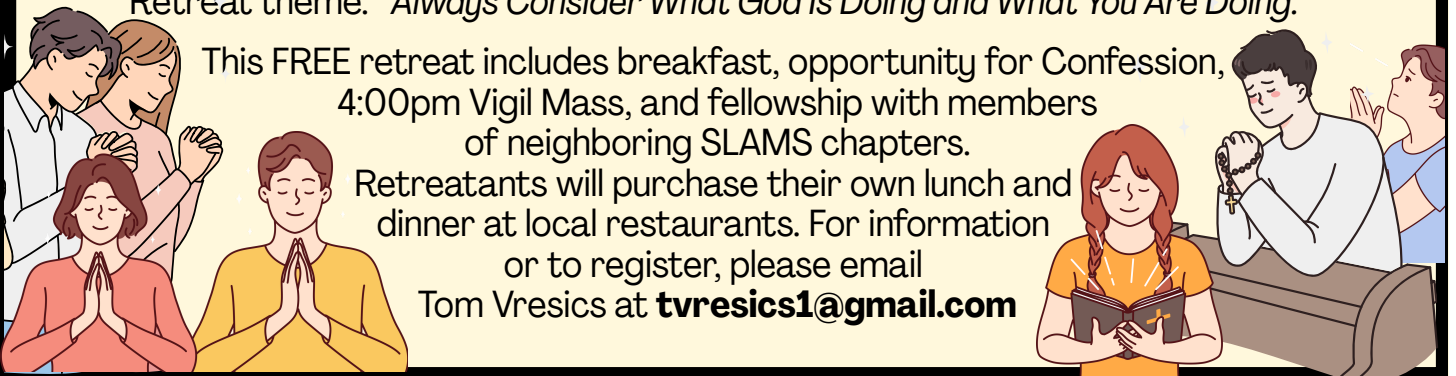

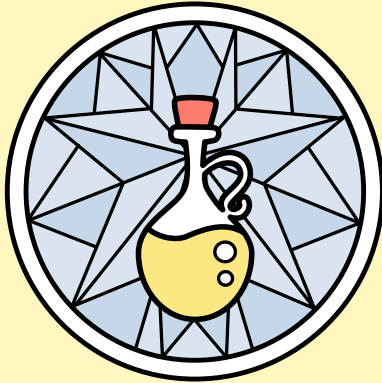

~ FOOD FOR THOUGHT ON THE SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME ~

Today's readings echo a profound truth of our faith: prayer is not merely asking — it is relationship. From Abraham's humble bargaining in Genesis, to the disciples' longing for instruction on how to pray, to Paul's reminder that we are already united with Christ — we are being drawn deeper into communion with God, our Abba.

In the First Reading, we see a stunning image of intimacy between a human being and the Almighty. Abraham doesn't demand, he doesn't manipulate — he pleads with reverence and humility: *"See how I am presuming to speak to my Lord, though I am but dust and ashes."* This is no cold transaction. This is personal. Abraham is appealing not just to God's power, but to God's heart — to His justice, mercy, and covenant faithfulness. It is prayer rooted in relationship.

The Responsorial Psalm affirms this: *"Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me."* This isn't wishful thinking — it is a testimony from one who knows God listens. Prayer is not a coin we toss into a vending machine of grace. It is the ongoing dialogue of love between the Creator and His beloved sons and daughters.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul doesn't speak about prayer as a separate act from life, but as something flowing out of who we are in Christ. We have died and been raised with Him. We are already in communion with God through baptism. Prayer, then, is simply living out that reality. It's not performance, it's participation.

Then comes the Gospel — that moment when Jesus' disciples, watching Him in prayer, are drawn to the source of His strength, peace, and intimacy with the Father. *"Lord, teach us to pray,"* they ask — and He does. Not with abstract theory, but with the Our Father. A prayer that begins not with what we want, but with who God is: *"Father, hallowed be Your name, Your kingdom come..."* Here lies the heart of prayer. Not a list of demands, but the surrender of a child. Not manipulation, but trust. Not fear, but relationship.

Prayer as ACTS: Adoration • Contrition • Thanksgiving • Supplication

A helpful acronym to understand this movement of prayer is A.C.T.S.:

Adoration — Prayer begins in awe. *"Hallowed be Thy name."* We don't rush to our needs; we gaze first at the face of God. We praise Him because He is worthy — whether or not our petitions are granted.

Contrition — We must recognize our smallness, our sin, our deep need for mercy. *"Forgive us our sins..."* Abraham said, *"I am but dust and ashes,"* not in shame, but in holy humility. Contrition opens the door to grace.

Thanksgiving — How often do we thank God not just for past blessings, but in advance for what He is doing in our lives, even when we don't see it yet? *"The Lord will complete what He has done for me,"* the psalmist declares.

Supplication — Only then do we lift up our needs, not in desperation, but in confidence. *"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find..."* Jesus teaches us to persevere in prayer, not because God is reluctant, but because we need to grow in trust.

The Greek verbs Jesus uses — "ask," "seek," and "knock" — are in a form that implies continuous, ongoing action. Keep asking. Keep seeking. Keep knocking. Because God is always listening — not like a tired judge or a disinterested king, but like a Father who delights in giving good gifts.

Prayer is a Relationship to Be Lived, Not a Task to Complete

Prayer is not just about what we say. It's about Who we're with. We can pray in the car, in the shower, over the stove, before a meeting, in bed, in the pew. But the point is not just frequency — it's familiarity. Prayer that flows from relationship transforms us. It draws us from fear to freedom, from control to surrender, from worry to peace.

When we only pray in moments of crisis, we treat God like a stranger. But when we pray constantly, we are never far from His presence. And that's the relationship Jesus is inviting us into — not ritual, but reality. He invites us to experience God as "Abba" — as Papa, as Daddy, as the One who loves us more than we can imagine.

Reflection Questions for Personal Action

- What is my image of God when I pray? Is He distant? Disinterested? Or is He the loving Father Jesus reveals?
- Do I pray daily — not just in need, but in praise and thanksgiving?
- Am I persistent in prayer, or do I give up too quickly?
- Do I intercede for others like Abraham did for Lot — with trust, love, and urgency?
- How can I grow in my relationship with God this week — through Scripture, silence, Adoration, or journaling?

Closing Thought

Prayer is not a magic formula. It is not a religious duty box to check. It is the breath of the soul. It is the daily embrace between God and His children. The more we pray, the more we know Him. And the more we know Him, the more we will love, trust, and obey Him.

So today — don't just say prayers. Live prayerfully. Lift your heart. Speak with your Abba. And know that He is already listening.

"If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him?" — Luke 11:13
