August 29: The Passion of St. John the Baptist

St. John the Baptist was the cousin of Jesus, and also the nephew of Our Lady. John had the courage to blame King Herod to his face for the scandal of his illegal union with his sister-in-law Herodias, whose husband was still alive. Herod had John imprisoned because of his outspokenness. On Herod's birthday, his new wife's daughter danced before the king and his guests. Her dancing pleased Herod so much that he promised to give her anything she desired. The girl was persuaded by Herodias to ask for the head of John the Baptist on a platter. Although dismayed by the request, Herod had John executed in prison. He was beheaded, and his head given to Herod's daughter.

In his lifetime, St. John the Baptist spoke the truth with great courage, and moved people to embrace the ways of God. He did this not only by preaching, but also by example. He fasted in the desert, and prepared the way for Jesus. He wasn't fearful of speaking out about the immoral activities of his day, even though his boldness ultimately led to his death. Like St. John the Baptist, we must be fearless in confronting evil and calling it by its true name.

In today's second reading, Saint Paul wrote to the Hebrews about being disciplined by God. When we are young God wants our parents to make sure we behave well. When we don't behave He wants them to discipline us so that we will learn to be good.



Our parents don't punish us just because they are angry at us; they do it because they really love us and want us to learn to be better. Saint Paul says that the Lord disciplines the people that He loves.

Being punished is a painful thing, but we will be happy once we have learned our lesson and become a better person. Saint Paul says, "make a straight path for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed." He means that when you are punished, you should stop doing the wrong thing so that you won't be hurt worse from the punishment, but will get better instead. So the next time you are disciplined or punished, remember that God is allowing it to help you become a better person. If you can, even thank God for giving you the chance


