

# If you have noticed the convent chapel lights on recently or the three women present on our parish campus during Holy Mass or Holy Hour, you might be wondering: "Who are they?"

In seeking to initiate a discernment process towards forming a new religious community, these women requested permission from the Most Reverend Alfred Schlert to live in common hile continuing to hold their ministerial positions in our Diocese. With the support of Father John Hutta, our pastor, the Bishop assigned St. Theresa's Convent as the location for their communal living experience, and they moved into the convent this past July. These women share a vision for a bilingual community of religious sisters who proclaim the Gospel, as expressed in St. John Paul II's Catechesis on Human Love, commonly known as the Theology of the Body. Understanding the human person as created in the image and likeness of God, they seek to present human sexuality and family life as God's merciful gift. They entrust themselves and this vision to Jesus in the Holy Eucharist and to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These women also serve our Diocese by praying for priests, religious, and families, while supporting all forms of vocational discernment. By hosting a monthly discernment group meeting in the convent, they specifically support women in their vocational discernment—whether to marriage or religious life. For those women specifically feeling called to the religious life, they also offer monthly "Come-and-See" weekends. 
The St. Theresa Grief Support Group meets


