"Living Stones in the Little Way: A Reflection for St. Theresa Parish, Hellertown"

May the Lord Jesus continue to make His presence known to, and through you, and may you be a source of other people's remembering that GOD is with them. At St. Theresa of the Child Jesus Parish in Hellertown, we are blessed to stand on holy ground—ground watered by the faith, tears, and sacrifices of generations before us. Every pew, every brick, every candle lit in prayer tells the story of a people who believe that God dwells here. Yet this beautiful church, like the Temple of old, is not merely a structure of stone and glass—it is a living symbol of who we are as the People of God. As Scripture reminds us, "You are God's building... Do you not know that you are the temple of God?" (1 Cor 3:9, 16). The Lord Jesus is our foundation, and upon Him, each of us is placed as a "living stone," carefully chosen, perfectly fitted, and lovingly joined to one another by the Spirit's mortar of grace. Here at St. Theresa's, our story continues to unfold—not only in marble and mortar, but in mercy and mission. Like the Basilica of St. John Lateran, the "Mother Church" of all Christendom, our parish is a sign of the universal Church and a reminder that holiness begins not in perfection, but in participation—in the willingness to let God dwell within us, unfinished though we may be.

A Church Always Under Construction In the early days of St. Theresa Parish, families gathered in a modest structure, their hearts set on heaven and their hands on the work before them. The church has been renovated, expanded, renewed—but in truth, the real construction never stopped. We are still becoming the Church God dreams us to be. We are each "unfinished cathedrals," marked by grace yet still in need of refinement. There are areas in our souls that still need polishing, corners that need light, and cracks that need filling with charity. But even in our incompleteness, the Divine Architect is at work. This truth is echoed in the wisdom of our patroness, St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus, who wrote: "Perfection consists in doing His will, in being what He wills us to be." And again: "Let us love, since that is what our hearts were made for." Her Little Way reminds us that holiness is not about grand gestures or flawless stonework—it's about doing small things with great love. Every act of patience, every moment of forgiveness, every quiet sacrifice becomes a brick in the Church God is building within us.

The Beauty of the Church and the Beauty of the Soul When Fr. Francis Vlossak built our church in Hellertown amid poverty and grime, he insisted, "My people see only drear all day. I want them to see beauty on Sunday." We, too, at St. Theresa's, understand that beauty evangelizes. Our renovated sanctuary, our luminous stained glass, our music and worship—all of these are more than decoration; they are proclamation. They tell a weary world: You were made for the beauty of Heaven. But the physical beauty of our church must always lead to the inner beauty of our souls. The golden altar means little if our hearts are tarnished by resentment. The polished marble gleams best when it mirrors the radiance of faith and charity in our lives. As St. Thérèse said: "The loveliest masterpiece of the heart of God is the heart of a mother." And so too, the loveliest masterpiece of the Church is the soul that allows God to dwell within it. At St. Theresa's, every act of kindness—whether preparing a meal for the poor, teaching our children the faith, visiting the sick, or praying quietly before the tabernacle—adds another brushstroke to the masterpiece of Christ's living Church.

Water Flowing from the Temple The prophet Ezekiel saw water flowing from the Temple, giving life wherever it went. We see this same river of grace flowing from the pierced Heart of Christ—through the sacraments, through our parish community, and through every baptized soul who becomes a channel of God's mercy. That river runs through Hellertown. It flows in the laughter of our children during Catechesis, in the hymns sung at Sunday Mass, in the tears shed at funerals, and in the joy of baptisms and wedding. It flows in quiet service, in confessions whispered, in candles lit for loved ones, and in the faith of parishioners who built this house of prayer a century ago. That is why, as we look toward our Centennial Jubilee, we are not merely celebrating a hundred years of history—we are celebrating a hundred years of holiness: of people allowing God's living water to flow through them, bringing life to the Lehigh Valley and beyond.

Becoming the Dwelling Place of God Jesus cleansed the Temple not because He despised it, but because He loved it too much to let it become cluttered. The same Lord desires to cleanse our hearts, so that His presence may shine clearly through us. St. Thérèse prayed, "Jesus, make me Your little host." That is our prayer, too—that our lives may become tabernacles of His presence. When people encounter us—whether at the grocery store, in the classroom, or in the pew—they should be able to sense something radiant, something of the divine. Not because we are perfect, but because Christ dwells within us. At St. Theresa of the Child Jesus Parish, may we continue to build up the Church, stone by living stone, through the simplicity of love. May our parish be a place where hearts are lifted, wounds are healed, and souls are reminded: "God is here. God is with us." And when our work feels small or unseen, let us remember the words of our Little Flower: "I will spend my heaven doing good on earth." May she continue to intercede for her parish family here in Hellertown, that we may live the Little Way with great love, and become the living temple of Christ in our time.

Reflection Questions • How am I allowing the beauty of my soul to reflect the beauty of God's dwelling within me? • Where might Jesus be calling me to "cleanse the temple" of my heart from distraction or spiritual clutter? • In what "little way" can I let His presence be known through me this week—at home, in ministry, in my work, or among my neighbors?


