## First Reading:

Is 35:1-6. 10

#### God himself will come and save us.

Let the wilderness and the drylands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy. The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God. 



## 100th anniversary of the First Saturday devotion: Origin of the First Saturday devotion

On December 10, 1925, the feast of **Our Lady of Loreto**, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Sr. Lucia at a convent in Pontevedra, Spain.

In this new private revelation eight years after the visions at Fatima, Mary requested the institution of the five consecutive First Saturday devotions in reparation to her Immaculate Heart.

Here are the words of the Virgin Mary: "Look, My daughter, at My Heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce Me at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You at least try to console Me and announce in My name that I promise to assist at the moment of death, with all the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep Me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to Me."

# Charlie Kirk was 'close' to becoming a Catholic as he meditated on Virgin Mary as solution to 'toxic feminism'

The assassinated conservative activist Charlie Kirk was reportedly close to becoming a Catholic at the time of his death, which included him considering the Virgin Mary as a solution to "toxic feminism" in the United States.

Robert Brennan, a Los Angeles-based writer and the brother of Bishop Joseph Brennan of Fresno, California, has written about how Kirk had a "personal exchange" with the Californian prelate about a week before the 31-year-old CEO and co-founder of Turning Point USA was killed at Utah Valley University on 10 September, reports the Catholic News Agency (CNA).

In an 18 September column for Angelus, the Los Angeles archdiocesan newspaper, Robert Brennan wrote that Kirk had spoken to his bishop brother at a prayer breakfast, telling the prelate "about his Catholic wife and children and how he attended Mass with them".

Kirk had acknowledged "speculation" about his interest in becoming Catholic and told Bishop Brennan: "I'm this close" to converting, Robert Brennan wrote in Angelus.

Brennan notes that his brother had given him permission to share the story. He also highlights a recent video made by Kirk, in which while the evangelical Christian acknowledged some "big disagreements" with Catholicism, he also discussed how Protestants "under-value" the Virgin Mary. "We don't talk about Mary enough. We don't venerate her enough," said Kirk, arguing that Mary is "the solution [to] toxic feminism" in the US.
