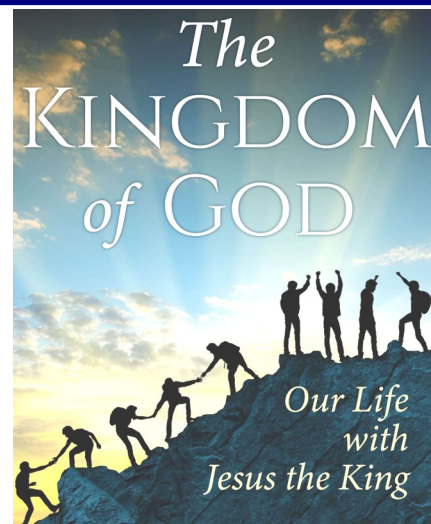
Gospel Acclamation:

Dear Parishioners,

The Eucharist is Everything.

Jesus instituted the Eucharist for us, and He instituted us for the Eucharist.

A life centred on the Eucharist is the ultimate fulfilment, realised or unrealised, of every human being who has come into existence, from the beginning of the Church until now. Souls realise this to the extent that they allow God the time and space to convert the spiritual engines of their hearts to run on this heavenly fuel.

The Catholic Church calls parish priests “to take care that the blessed Eucharist is the centre of the parish assembly of the faithful. He is to strive to ensure that the faithful are nourished by the devout celebration of the sacraments, and in particular that they frequently approach the sacraments of the blessed Eucharist and penance.”

(Canon 528§2).

With this in mind, every decision I make as parish priest, explicitly or implicitly, should aim at making the Eucharist a more significant reality in the life of each parishioner. Having consulted a number of parishioners and the Parish Pastoral Council, I'd like to propose the following suggestions for us to trial over the coming months:

Regular Weekday Evening Masses

In addition to our existing weekday morning masses, I propose to add regular evening masses, beginning with Tuesdays and Thursdays at 7pm. If there is an evident need for this (40 or so parishioners consistently attending for a month), then we will add Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays at 7pm. Evening masses will be preceded by Confessions until 8pm. This will begin as soon as our assistant parish priest, Fr. Petelo, arrives.

Removal of Collections During Mass

To allow parishioners to stay more focussed on the Liturgy, I propose that we remove the practice of passing around collection plates during Mass. A secure box will be placed at the back of church for those who wish to make cash/envelope donations before or after Mass. If the Diocese requests a one-off collection for some special purpose, collection plates can be passed around at the end of Mass, during announcements, as usual. This will begin as soon as I have sourced the collection box.

Installation of Air-Conditioning

An unbearably hot church is a significant distraction and deterrent to full participation in Mass, so we should do what we can to remedy this. Fr. Brendan had long intended to install air-conditioners in the church, and was waiting for the parish to achieve a certain degree of financial security, which we are now anticipating. The air-conditioners will be installed as soon as the financing is confirmed.

Single side kneelers for Communion

As additional assistance for those who would like to receive Communion whilst kneeling, a single kneeler will be provided off to the side of each Eucharistic minister at Communion - everyone is most welcome to use them or not use them, as they prefer. These will be provided beginning the First Sunday of Lent.

I will have a few more suggestions in the coming months, but I believe this is an achievable place to start. As I said, all of these suggestions are intended to make the Eucharist, and our celebration of it, more meaningful for you. If in practice they aren't proving to do this, then we can try something else, or simply return to what we had.

Long Live Jesus in the Eucharist!
