Series on the Mass – Week 5 The Eucharistic Prayer – The Heart of the Mass

After the gifts are prepared, the priest begins the **Eucharistic Prayer** - the *high point of the entire Mass*. It begins with the **Preface**, a prayer of thanksgiving, and then we join the angels and saints in heaven singing: "**Holy**, **Holy**, **Holy Lord**, **God of hosts.**" In that moment, heaven and earth unite in worship!

The Consecration – Heaven Touches Earth: The priest extends his hands over the gifts, calling down the Holy Spirit - the Epiclesis 1 to sanctify them. Then, repeating the words of Jesus at the Last Supper: "This is my Body... This is my Blood," the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Christ - not a symbol, but Christ Himself, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. That's why we genuflect, the bells ring, and the priest elevates the host and chalice - because heaven has come down to earth.

The Memorial and Offering: After the consecration, the priest remembers Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection, offering the spotless Victim - **Christ Himself** - to the Father. Here the priest stands *in persona Christi* - it is Christ who offers Himself through the hands of the priest. We, the faithful, join in that offering, especially in our resounding **Great Amen:** "**Through Him, with Him, and in Him...**" This is our declaration of faith: "Yes, Lord! I believe! I offer myself with You!"

The Lord's Prayer and the Sign of Peace: We then pray together the **Our Father**, the prayer Jesus Himself taught us, reminding us that we are *one family, one body*, calling God "*Our Father*." After that, we share the **Sign of Peace** - not just as a friendly greeting, but as a gesture of reconciliation and unity before receiving the Lord.

"Lamb of God" – Preparing Our Hearts: As we sing, "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us," we recognize our unworthiness yet trust in God's mercy. When the priest proclaims, "Behold the Lamb of God," we echo the centurion's humble faith: "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof..."

Holy Communion - Union with Christ: Now comes the most intimate moment - Holy Communion. Christ, whom we have listened to in the Word and adored on the altar, comes to dwell within us. We receive not a thing, but a *Person* - Jesus Himself - who fills our hearts with His love and peace. After Communion, take time in silence to thank, adore, and speak to the Lord in your heart.

The Eucharist Transforms Us: The Liturgy of the Eucharist is truly the heart of our faith - Calvary made present, heaven touching earth, and God giving Himself in love. Each time we come to Mass, we are invited to place our lives on the altar, to be transformed, and to become what we receive - the Body of Christ for the world. So, at every Mass, don't just watch what happens - pray it, live it, and let it change you from within. -To be continued...
