Arizona Medical Association Welcomes 131st President, Dr. Jennifer Hartmark-Hill

April 28, 2022 (Phoenix) — The Arizona Medical Association (ArMA) is pleased to announce the election of our 131st president, Jennifer Hartmark-Hill, MD, FAAFP. Dr. Hartmark-Hill has a rich history of involvement in the medical community, and she will be an exemplary leader and advocate during her one-year term as president.

“It is truly an honor to serve as president of an organization that has strongly established credibility and a proven track record within the healthcare community, reflecting a long history of success serving both physicians and patients of Arizona,” expressed Dr. Hartmark-Hill. “As president, I am dedicated to furthering ArMA’s mission, with a focus on empowering physicians’ leadership. I look forward to bringing the physician community together in the spirit of service to one another, our profession, and our patients.”

Dr. Hartmark-Hill is a Mayo Clinic-trained Family Medicine physician, an alum of the University of Arizona College of Medicine – Phoenix (UA COM-P), and an award-winning medical educator. She currently serves in many capacities at UA COM-P, acting as Director of the Faculty Development Fellowship, Director of the Program for Narrative Medicine & Health Humanities, and Director of the Patient-Centered Care curriculum. In 2021 she received the “Excellence in Education” award from the Maricopa County Medical Society (MCMS).

In addition to serving as a physician educator, Dr. Hartmark-Hill volunteers her time to care for vulnerable populations, including patients experiencing homelessness through Street Medicine Phoenix. In recognition of her work, she received the “Outstanding Leadership” Award from the S.H.O.W. Community Health initiative and UA COM-P’s Gold Humanism Award in 2020.

Dr. Hartmark-Hill also dedicates much of her time to organized medicine. In recent years, she has served on ArMA’s Board of Directors, Public Health Committee, Legislative & Governmental Affairs Committee, Arizona Medical Political Action Committee (ArMPAC) Board of Directors, and American Medical Association (AMA) Delegation, among other roles. In addition to her involvement in ArMA, she is a member of more than 11 professional associations, including the Arizona Academy of Family Physicians, Arizona Women in Healthcare, and the Arizona Public Health Association.

“ArMA will be well-served under Dr. Hartmark-Hill’s capable leadership,” said ArMA’s CEO, Libby McDannell. “Her expertise, patient-centric mindset, and organizational leadership experience make her ideally qualified to lead ArMA.
