Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." (John 6:67-68)

This is a question that every follower of Jesus has to ponder at one time or another. Something or someone will always demand our allegiance. Our choice about who or what to follow, or who or what to love. will determine everything.

With Opened Bible Fr. Dimitri

"It was necessary that the Word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles." (Acts of the Apostles 13,

The fourth Sunday of Easter is called Good Shepherd Sunday. On this Sunday, the Church also prays for priestly vocations, which are the divine callings for individuals to serve as priests in the Church, following the example of Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

The Gospel draws our attention to the Person of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who tenderly cares for the flock. "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me." (John 10:27) By saying "my sheep," Jesus assures us of his nurturing love, inheriting the divine titles of the Old Testament.

In some Psalms, as in the Prophets, the Shepherd is God. He saved Israel from Egypt and planted it in the holy land of Canaan: 'O Shepherd of Israel, lend an ear, you who guide Joseph like a flock!' (Psalm 80:2) The Shepherd, a metaphor used in the Bible, represents God's love for guiding, protecting, and nourishing His people. Just as a shepherd looks after his scattered flock, God promises to look after His people, rescuing them from all the places where they were scattered on a day of clouds and darkness. This metaphor of the Shepherd is a powerful image of God's care and love for His people.

But who are these people? Who is the flock? Israel was the first chosen according to the Old Testament of Abraham. "You shall be my people, and I will be your God." That is the formula of the Covenant. (Cf. Jeremiah 30:22; Exodus 6:7; Ezekiel 36:28; Hosea 2:23) However, Israel closed its heart to the prophetic Word announcing the Messiah. It turned its eyes away and withered away in indifference. Jesus appeared as the Word made flesh, but Israel, his people, did not receive him. (Cf. John 1:11). The Book of Acts of the Apostles sheds light on this subject when the apostle declared: "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles." (Acts of the Apostles 13:46)

The closing of their hearts opened the way to salvation for the Gentiles, the pagan nations. Thus is fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah: "I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth." (Isaiah 42:6). Jesus, the light of the world, is proclaimed to all (pagan) nations. Thus, the Church, including each one of us, will be the New Israel built not on the Covenant and the law but on Christ's new and eternal sacrifice. The Christians become "light for the world" through Jesus the Light. (Matthew 5, 14)

The power to witness the light is entrusted to the Church, the New and spiritual Israel.



Why does a cardinal change his name upon becoming Pope?

First, let's return to the Holy Scriptures for a better understanding. "Changing one's name" is a way of saying that one has received a new mission or a new identity. Abram becomes Abraham when God makes him "the Father of the nations in faith." (Cf. Genesis 17:5) Jacob becomes Israel after his victory over the Angel. (Genesis 32:28) And Simon becomes Peter (Kephas) (Cf. Matthew 16:17-18) Alongside the testimony of the Bible, Church history tells us that the first pope to change his name was Mercury (a pagan name honoring the God Mercury), who reigned between 465 and 555. He became John II. From the 11th century onward, it became common and even legal for a pope to change his name. This change could be related to his patron saint or to imitate a saint's or another pope's virtues. Cardinal Bergoglio chose the name Saint Francis to make the Church closer to the poor and more humble, like the Master. (Cf. Matthew 11:29) The name of reign is also a way of defining a pontificate and showing everyone what will be done and accomplished.

FOR THE "Just a Mom"

"The most important person on earth is a mother. She cannot claim the honor of having built Notre Dame Cathedral. She need not. She has built something more magnificent than any cathedral—a dwelling for an immortal child, the tiny perfection of her baby's body.

The angels have not been blessed with such a grace.

They cannot share in God's creative miracle to bring a new saint to heaven. Only a human mother can. Mothers are closer to God the Creator than any other creature. God joins forces with mothers in performing this act of creation. What on God's good earth is more glorious than this, to be a mother?"

Joszef Cardinal Mindszenty

So here's the thing. There IS no such thing as "just a mom"." Every mother is also first and foremost a beloved daughter of God and a woman created in His image and likeness. She is also usually wife, daughter, sister, manager, and the facilitator of a million other things each and every day within her family. But there is absolutely NOTHING wrong or less than being (what is deemed "just a mom." As a mother you have one of the most important roles on earth, far more important than any ministry, side job, speaking gig, social media presence, hobby, or anything else. God may call some women to take on other roles, but that's His prer

ogative and another way that the feminine genius can be revealed. But in no way do these "extras" make another mother more worthy or more woman than the mom who is at home

raising her family and devoting herself to making a home. It's okay and beautiful and good to be content with that and embrace it.

Remember, the most influential and significant woman who ever lived was "just" a mom. She had no degree. No job. No side hustle. No institutional education. She had no remarkable achievements. No earthly awards. No lengthy resume. She never wrote a book, but thousands have been written about her. She never recorded an album, but hundreds of songs are dedicated to her. She never owned a piece of land, but has cities, states and capitals named for her.

Her greatest acclaim is that she said yes. She opened her womb and she became a mom, one whom God Himself would honor, obey and submit to.

With her, let's remember that the most influential work we mothers do will always be within the hearts, minds, souls, and bodies of our children and within the walls of our home. Despite how difficult, unrewarding, exhausting, and sometimes maligned it is, it is beautiful, good, holy, and the most important work. Whether you are a mother with callings outside the home or are dedicated full time in the home to motherhood, don't ever forget that! This work resonates for generations and is the most eternally significant for us and our children. No one can replace you as Mother and there's no "just" anything about that.


