

School Academic Achievement Goals

Goal #1: By the end of FY24 school year, we will increase our Milestone ELA performance on Levels 2, 3, 4 by 1-3% from the previous years performance.

Goal #2: By the end of FY24 school year, we will increase our Milestone Math performance on Levels 2, 3, 4 by 1-3% from the previous years performance.

District/CLIP Goals

Goal #1: By 2026, we would like to increase overall reading fluency on grade-level assessment reading/fluency measures to 85% with percentages increasing to 95% within five years.

Goal #2: By 2026, we would like to increase student achievement to 90% overall in math and 75% in Algebra 1 through a combination of new mindset shifts to more mathematical reasoning and statistical reasoning in the early grades (new Georgia Math Standards) and increased support for 9th grade Algebra 1 readiness.
