Amen.




Dear Families.

Writing Moderation

Each term our staff gather to moderate writing samples of students from each class. Writing moderation in primary schools provides a range of benefits for both teachers and students. It plays a key role in improving consistency, fairness, and the quality of teaching and learning. Here are the main benefits:

Ensures Consistency and Fairness in Assessment

- · Teachers collaboratively agree on what different standards of writing look like.
- · Promotes fair grading across classes and year levels.
- · reduces subjectivity in marking.

Supports Teacher Professional Development

- · Encourages professional dialogue around curriculum standards and assessment criteria.
- · Builds confidence in making judgements about student writing.

Improves Student Outcomes

- \cdot Teachers gain a clearer understanding of what students need to do to improve.
- · Informs planning, feedback, and differentiation.
- · Students receive accurate and constructive feedback.

Enhances Curriculum Alignment

- · Ensures that writing tasks and assessments are aligned with curriculum expectations (national standards).
- · Promotes consistency across schools.

Builds a Collaborative Teaching Culture

- · Strengthens collaboration and shared understanding within teaching teams.
- · Encourages reflective practice and continuous improvement.

Identifies Gaps in Teaching or Learning
