

Simon/PAM

On Friday 24 October, the SIMON service, including access to the Parent Access Module (PAM) and SIMONEverywhere mobile application were taken offline after some unusual login attempts were detected. This involved the unauthorised use of student and staff user credentials to create fake accounts.

St. Michael's and SIMONSchools take cyber security very seriously. External experts have been engaged to help ensure we take all appropriate action in response to this activity.

From our investigation to date, we do <u>not</u> have any evidence to suggest that any user information held on the platform has been affected, or that any other systems are involved. Should this position change, we will notify relevant parties as required.

Students will be able to access SIMON whilst logged in on-campus, however we will be keeping SIMONEverywhere and the Parent Access Module (PAM) offline until further notice. This precaution is being taken to ensure the safety and security of all users while we work to further understand this unusual activity and resolve the situation.

If you need to log a student absence during this period, update important medical information or provide consent for an excursion, please contact our school directly via admin@smdaylesford.catholic.edu.au or (03) 5348 1261.

We understand this may cause some inconvenience and appreciate your patience and support as we work to restore full service.

We will be in touch with a further update regarding access to PAM and SIMON Everywhere as soon as we can. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Swimming

Professional Learning with Shane Crawford

On Wednesday, we welcomed Shane Crawford - Director of EduPoint to our school. Over the past 6 years, Shane has worked with St. Michael's students and staff on how we can maximize learning and teaching opportunities at school.

A St Michael's Learner.....

Learning Clarity - Understanding of Learning

- Knows and understands how they learn best
- Knows the learning intentions and success criteria
- Has goals to support their learning
- Has clarity around where they are at with their learning and where to next
- Is well-rounded and connects their learning to different ways of knowing
- Applies their knowledge to real-world scenarios
- Feedback skills can both give and receive feedback from others

A learner understands how they learn best and the learning intentions and success criteria, sets goals to support their learning, possesses clarity about their current progress and next steps, connects their learning to various perspectives, applies knowledge to real-world scenarios, and effectively gives and receives feedback.

Dispositions - Collaboration

- Is collaborative and can express their thoughts and feelings freely
- Can empathise with others
- Is collaborative and curious
- Isn't afraid to make mistakes
- Sees mistakes as opportunities for growth
- Understands when and how they need support
- Knows what to do when they don't know what to do
- Knows that it's OK not to know
- Persistent and never gives up
- Open-minded to alternative perspectives
- Resilient grit will persevere in challenges
- Shows courage and grit in the face of challenge
- Critical thinker questions things: the why not and how to
- Resourceful knows how they learn and how they can go about solving problems
- Uses a range of resources to assist with learning not just the teacher
- Respectful dignity for the human person regardless of who they are

A learner demonstrates collaboration by expressing thoughts and feelings freely while empathizing with others and remaining curious; embraces a growth mindset by viewing mistakes as opportunities for growth, knowing when and how to seek support being comfortable with uncertainty; exhibits resilience and grit through persistence, open-mindedness, and courage in challenges; engages in critical thinking, is resourceful in understanding their learning process and utilising various resources beyond the teacher; and shows respect by upholding the dignity of every individual.

A learner embodies the St Michael's 5 by modelling its values, feeling safe and supported in their learning environment, serving as a positive role model to peers, taking full responsibility, demonstrating empathy towards individual differences, and contributing positively to a respectful learning atmosphere.

Engagement - Willingness to Try

- Gives things a go even if it's something not of interest
- Are focused learners
- Demonstrates autonomy
- Exhibits independence as they get what they put in
- Independent and confident to have a go
- Learns from others
- Motivated to be better than yesterday

A learner demonstrates engagement by willingly trying new things, maintaining focus and independence, exhibiting autonomy, learning from others, and being motivated to improve themselves each day.

Catholic Learner - Spirituality

- Exhibits a sense of belief in the greater good
- Embodies Gospel values promoting a nurturing environment and Catholic identify

A Catholic learner exhibits a belief in the greater good and embodies Gospel values that promote a nurturing environment and a strong Catholic identity.

As you can see, an extensive list has been created! As a staff, we will now spend some time creating 10 'A St. Michael's Learner' statements which can be followed by students.

It is not always easy for children to always know how to manage friendships. LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

2025 School fees

Many thanks to the families who have paid any outstanding school fees for 2025. We ask that all families who are yet to pay their school fees for this year to **finalise payment by November 20**. 2026 School fees

Family Tuition Fee

This fee is charged on a family basis. In 2026 it will be **\$1100 per year**. This may be payable in weekly, fortnightly or quarterly instalments via direct debit.

Funds from the Family Tuition Fee provide the bulk of our local contribution towards the cost of the day to day operation of the school.

The State and Commonwealth Governments also provide funds for this purpose.

Family Capital Fee

This fee is charged on a family basis and is \$ 290 per family.

Funds from the Family Capital Fee assist in meeting the building and grounds improvements and maintenance. This fee is payable in the same way as the Family Tuition Fee.

Technology Fee

This fee is charged on a per student basis and is \$100

Funds from the Technology Fee go towards the purchase of notebooks, hardware, software, licences and maintenance of these items.

Swimming Fee

This fee is charged on a per student basis and is \$90

Student Fee

This fee is charged on a per student basis and is \$260.

Funds from the Student Fee go towards the cost of student requisites for class and school programs throughout the year.

This fee is due for payment by Friday February 20, 2026

Camp Fee (students in Years 3-6): \$300

Students Commencing Year 3 in 2026 will receive a Chromebook computer (cost to be advised)


