The 2025/26 fiscal year reflected the extraordinary power of community generosity, with more than \$3,850,000 raised in support of local healthcare.

Donors, volunteers, businesses and community partners helped fund essential medical equipment not supported through government funding, while advancing the future of care in Prince Edward County.

This year marked the public launch of the PECMH Foundation’s \$1 million mammography campaign, alongside major milestones including the arrival of the mass timber for the new hospital site, record-breaking community events and the celebration of PECMH Foundation’s 40th anniversary.

Together, these moments reflect the compassion, volunteerism and community spirit shaping the future of PECMH.

Rooted in Care: Arrival of Mass Timber

This year marked a major construction milestone with the delivery of mass timber from Northern Quebec to the new Prince Edward County Memorial Hospital site.

One of the most distinctive features of the new hospital design, the exposed wood structure embodies both innovation and sustainability while creating a warm, welcoming environment for patients, families and staff.

Under Quinte Health’s oversight, construction moves steadily forward, with the foundation complete, the structure well underway and interior mechanical and electrical systems now taking shape. Once complete, the new PECMH will be Canada’s first unencapsulated mass timber hospital, designed to support exceptional patient care while advancing sustainability through geothermal heating and cooling, solar energy and a net-zero-ready design.

In July 2025, the PECMH Foundation proudly celebrated its 40th anniversary. With the support of a special sponsorship from Bay of Quinte Mutual Insurance Co., we hosted several events, including *A Conversation with David Frum*, bringing the community together to celebrate the Foundation’s history, impact and future.

- The **Teeing Up Fore Health Care Golf Classic** hosted by Re/Max Quinte Ltd. raised a record-breaking **\$68,600** in support of our mammography campaign.

 - The PECMH Auxiliary committed to funding a new Echocardiogram machine for our current hospital.
