

REFLECTION

When Ward and I were married back in 2011, the theme of our wedding was 'Love is the only Reality'.

Craig, being the thoughtful philosopher he was, offered his own interpretation of this theme from the late Nobel prize winning poet, Rabindranath Tagore who said: 'Love is the only reality and it is not a mere sentiment. It is the ultimate truth that lies at the heart of creation':

'Plato defines love between people as being able to discover the real and unalterable perfect form of Love in the eternal realm. Perhaps this is what is meant in the quote ... "the ultimate truth at the heart of creation." Talking about what love *means* can cause you to *glimpse* Love in its purest form.

'For Plato, the masses live in a metaphorical cave, with their backs to the entrance; and think that reality is portrayed by the shadows on the walls of the cave. We never turn around to see the reality streaming in from the eternal realm. So: turn around, he encourages us, into the light, and discover the fruits of real everlasting love.'

Let us pray with confidence to God our Father, who raised Jesus Christ from the dead for the salvation of all.


Prayers are offered giving thanks for Craig's life, and for those who grieve.
