### The Lords Prayer



## **Joan's legendary Lamingtons**

**Block Cake:** 

1.5 cups SR flour & pinch of salt (sifted)

4 oz melted butter (not hot)

2 eggs fill cup with milk

Zest of 1 orange

1 cup sugar

Beat for 2 minutes

Bake in 350° oven for 35-45minutes

Chocolate glaze:

4 cups of soft icing sugar

1 tbsp butter

½ cup cocoa powder

2 cups boiling water

Sift icing sugar, add cocoa powder, add butter

and boiling water

Should be runny

Cut cake into lamington size squares

Coat with chocolate glaze and roll in coconut. Place on wire rack to dry
