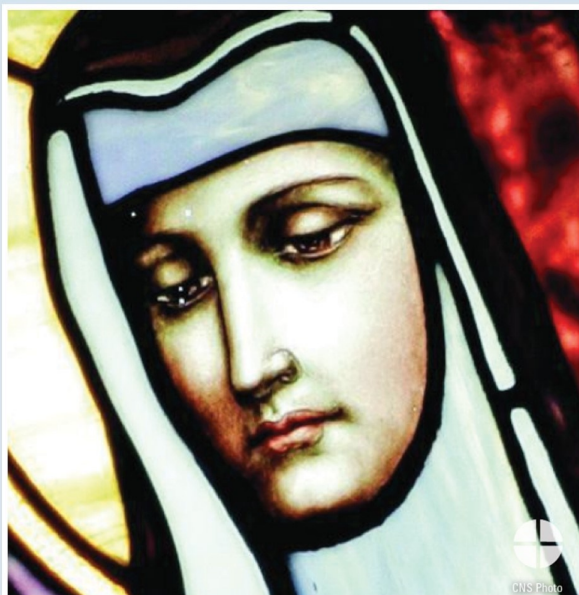

Saint Juliana of Falconieri

1270 - 1341

FEAST DAY: JUNE 19

Juliana was the only child of a wealthy couple in Florence, Italy, who had built the church of the Annunciation there. She refused to marry and was enrolled as a tertiary with the Servite order; her uncle, St. Alexis Falconieri, was one of the seven founders of the Servites. For nearly 20 years, Juliana lived a devout and useful life at home. In 1304 she formed a community of tertiary sisters who devoted themselves to prayer and good works in Florence. She is considered the foundress of the Servite community of nuns, and was canonized in 1737.

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NEW STAINED-GLASS WINDOWS AT ALL SAINTS

Sunday May 31, 2026 – the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity – was a happy day for All Saints Church in Eagle Butte, for on that day we unveiled the new stained-glass windows for all to see. The ooming and awing congregation consisted of about 45 people and one priest, who is also a person, so 46 people. A light brunch was shared after Mass to celebrate the event. Fr. JP acknowledged especially the Lisa Nelson (Ganje) memorial gift given by her family (Gary Nelson Family – who was also present for the unveiling) that initiated the fund for the project. A major donation was also given by the Schatz family in memory of Mike & Jenny Schatz. And Fr. Richard Reiser gave two separate donations in memory of his late brother and our old friend and lay minister, Mel Reiser. Other donations came from: Andy Fischer Memorial, Michael & Nanette Cepko, Kim & Colleen Kling Family, as well as several smaller amounts that we plan to record in a memorial plaque. I would like to thank Kenna LaPlante for helping sort through many ideas and also Mike Ganje.

As far as I can tell, when the church was built in 1971, the intention was to install stained-glass from the beginning, which is why each window had a single pane of $\frac{1}{4}$ " plexi-glass separating the outside world from the inside. The files show that efforts had been made in the past to complete this goal, but they stalled out for one reason or another. After consulting the Conrad Schmidt church design company, they proposed the windows that we now have... although we went through a series of ideas before settling with these. At one point, the price tag for one rendition was nearly \$92,000! The current windows cost just under \$40,000. They are simple but, in my opinion, bright and beautiful. 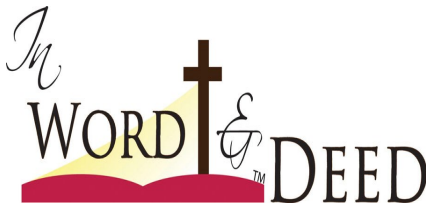
