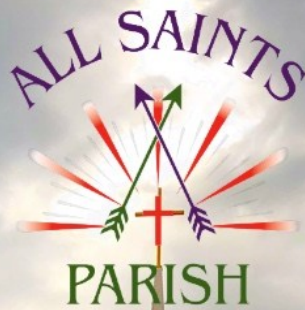

A Simple and Yet Deep Relationship with God

Melanie was one of several second graders who volunteered to help tidy up the church after the school Mass. Her mother asked her why she decided to help clean the church, but never found time to clean her room. "God needed a favor," she said, "so I did it. Then when I need a favor, God will help me." Her faith in God was straightforward and simple; He was just another friend with whom she shared secrets and favors.

It's easy to substitute theology for faith and complex debate for simple relationship. Like many of the best things in life, we understand best with the heart, not the mind. To explain God, is it easier to say that in the perfection of His being, free from all sin and darkness, God, as the omniscient and omnipotent Being, loves me completely and without fail, as I am, since he makes me in his image and likeness? Or is it better to say, God loves me like a grandparent who spoils me rotten? If you are not sure, trade favors with God today. You'll not only be surprised by what He gives you, you'll also be surprised by what you can give Him.

An Ode to the Parishioners of St. Catherine's in Promise

This address was delivered to the parishioners of St. Catherine's of Promise on the occasion of a Thanksgiving Mass for St. Catherine's held on June 28, 2026. As of July 1, 2026, St. Catherine's Church became the St. Catherine's Oratory – a chapel without regularly scheduled weekend Masses. Among other words, Fr. John Paul Trask honored the wonderful faith of the small but resilient congregation with the following words (slightly edited).

**You are always here, always happy to be here,
always prepared, your church is always clean,
Mass is always ready, you sing as good as you can,
you pray the responses of the Mass loud and
clear, you worship devoutly the Lord, you edify
every priest that enters this sanctuary, you greet
him warmly, then you pray with him, nay more,**

you lift him up in prayer. His prayer is lighter because of you. You respect his office, you patiently listen to his homilies even if they are boring, you try hard to stay awake even during a 4pm Mass Sunday afternoon (you don't pick your favorite Mass time; but you show up to the one offered), and in my experience you listen attentively even to my poorest homilies.

After Mass you clean things up and put them neatly away, then you greet the priest again, feed him with food lovingly prepared, generously served, hard-brought through muddy roads, special trips to a town not so near at all, rain or shine, wind or heat (I remember being here one morning at nearly -20 degrees and you were mostly all here!), heating up the cold and drafty hall, hauling bins and roasters, pans of bars, coffee and juice, a special granola bar for the priest for the road; no running water, no sink, no dumpster, no toilet with a heated seat, no toilet at all, only a shack out back with wasps and snakes and spiders, where business is done efficiently – where Jesus' words to Judas could aptly be inscribed: "What you must do, do quickly."

You maintain your church, fix the doors, windows, floors and lights, you mow the grass of this large yard. The cemetery is no dreadful and scary place, because *you* care for it. You take turns and spread the load of all these labors; you work together with order and harmony and as the Body of Christ you make all these burdens seem easy and light.

The priest who does not leave this church, this little community of love, this "diamond in the rough" (as a fellow priest once called it), this beautiful Body of Christ that you are – the priest who does not leave here more edified, more lifted up in spirit, more joyful, lighter, were not his belly so full, filled yet more with peace – that priest is a sad priest indeed! But I do not know of one. If Jesus promised a prophet's reward to one who offered only a small cup of water to disciple of Christ – how great will be your reward.
