Saint Mark the Evangelist

FIRST CENTURY | FEAST DAY — APRIL 25

According to the Acts of the Apostles, Mark's mother owned the house where the first Jerusalem Christians prayed and where Peter stayed after his miraculous release from prison (Acts 12:1-19). The New Testament also notes that Mark traveled with Paul and Barnabas on their mission to Antioch and that he was associated with both Paul and Peter in Rome. He may have written his Gospel, the shortest of the four, based on Peter's preaching while in Rome. By tradition, he was the martyred bishop of Alexandria, Egypt, with his relics later carried to Venice by Venetian merchants. In art, he is often symbolized by a lion. He is the patron saint of lions, lawyers, Venice, interpreters, and prisoners.



“Lord Jesus, open the Scriptures to us; make our hearts burn while you speak to us.”

This Gospel antiphon for this 3rd Sunday of Easter is inspired by the disciples’ encounter with Our Lord on the road to Emmaus. He opened the Scriptures to them until their hearts were “burning within them.” Jesus alone, the Word of God made flesh, rouses our flesh with the Word of God. *“For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And before him no creature is hidden, but all are open and laid bare to the eyes of him with whom we have to do”* (Hebrews 4.12). He is the key to unlock the Scriptures because he is Himself their meaning, their origin and end, and as his Spirit guided the authors, so too it must guide the interpreters. Without the Holy Spirit, that is, the Spirit of Jesus Christ, the Scriptures are indeed a sealed book. *“Who is worthy,”* a mighty angel proclaims, *“to open the scroll and break its seals?”... And I wept much that no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to look into it.”* Then one of the elders consoled St. John: *“Weep not; behold the Lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and its seven seals.”* (Revelation 5.1).

Jesus alone is the authoritative guide to understanding the Scriptures; without him as our guide, we need not bother opening a Bible because “the letter kills but the Spirit gives life.” Meaning, you can read the words, but you may as well eat husks and rinds, for the true fruit is yet sealed until He opens the Book. *“You search the Scriptures,”* Jesus challenged the Pharisees, *“because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness to me; yet you refuse to come to me that you may have life”* (John 5.39). The Pharisees were astounding biblical scholars; many of them were like living indexes of Scripture; they were enjoined by the Scriptures themselves to “bind them on their forehead” to “speak of them at home or abroad” and to “drill them into their children”. This is, in the end we now know, an injunction to us to “put on the mind of Christ” to “proclaim Christ and him crucified whether in season or out of season” and to baptize our children into the death of Christ. Still more, to live and die, to wake and sleep, to eat and drink the spiritual Body and Blood of Christ: *“If anyone thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the Scripture has said, ‘Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water.’ Now this he said about the Spirit, which those who believed in him were to receive”* (John 7.37).

He is the fountainhead of the Scriptures and he is like the ocean to which they all flow, while still he is the flowing water itself that if anyone drink *“the water that I shall give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life”* (John 4.14). This is why his listeners found their hearts burning within themselves when they heard him. They heard, in his words, their own maker. *“The voice of the Lord is upon the waters; the God of glory thunders, the Lord upon many waters. The voice of the Lord is power.”* No wonder the gospels recount that *“all the people hung upon his words.”*

In other words, if you plan to read the Scriptures, and I hope you all do, read them with Jesus. Say that wonderful prayer before you begin: *“Lord Jesus, open the Scriptures to us; make our hearts burn while you speak to us.”*
