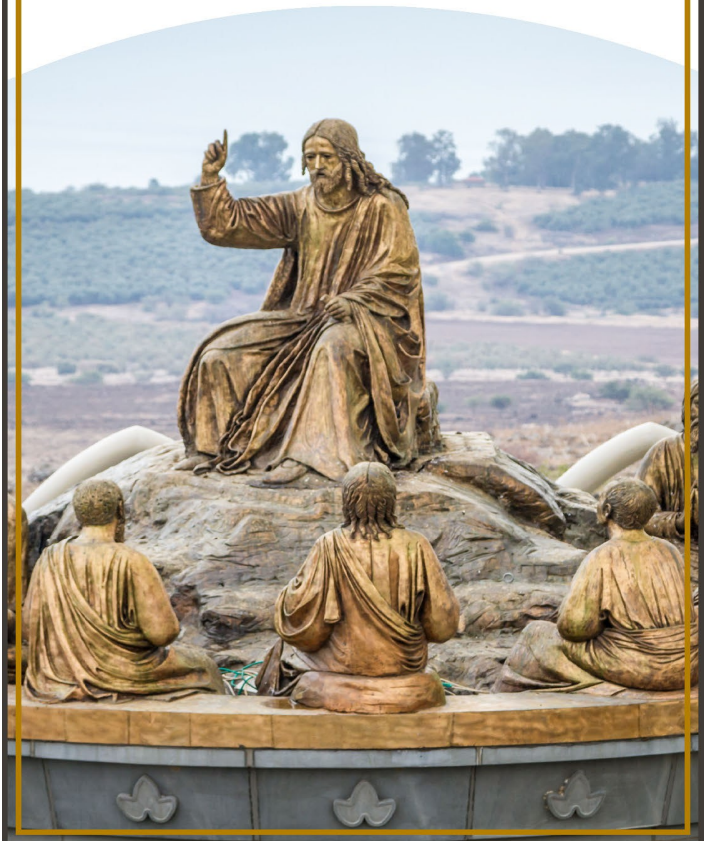

Our Lady of Fatima

Mary appeared to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal, six times between May 13 and October 13, 1917, and asked for prayers for world peace and an end to World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She entrusted the children with three secrets, regarding devotion to her Immaculate Heart, a vision of hell, and a “bishop in white” shot by soldiers firing bullets and arrows. Many connect the third secret to the attempted assassination of Blessed Pope John Paul II on May 13, 1981, and the pope thanked Mary for guiding the bullet and saving him. At the Vatican last October 13, Pope Francis stood before the statue of Our Lady from the Fatima shrine and formally entrusted the world to Mary.

Rogation Sunday

Rogation Days: A Forgotten Tradition Worth Keeping

Rogation Days come right before Ascension Day and are a time set aside to pray for God’s blessing on the land and the sea and the bounty that comes from them. As Christ prepares to ascend, we are reminded of our deep dependence on God for all things, both physical and spiritual, and we turn to Him in prayer.

Rogation Days originated in the 5th century in Vienne, France, and were created in response to a series of natural disasters that hit the area. The bishop of the area, Bishop Mamertus, called his people to days of fasting and prayer. They prayed that God would have mercy on the growth of their crops and spare them from famine. The word “rogation” comes from the Latin *rogare* and means “to ask.”

During Rogation Days, Christians would gather at their church and participate in processions around the parish called “The Beating of the Bounds.” The congregation would gather together and walk the boundary of the parish, beating the border of the parish with willow branches. As they walked, they prayed litanies, asking for God’s mercy and blessing over their land. If they lived by water, they would also pray for the blessing of the water.

To this day, Christians celebrate Rogation Days as a way to give thanks to God for the gifts of creation and to pray for His blessing on the land, crops, and the people who work the land. It is also traditionally a time of repentance—a time to humble ourselves before God, recognizing our dependence on Him and turning our hearts back to Him.

This year, Rogation Sunday falls on 17th May (Ascension Sunday). It provides an opportunity to seek God’s blessing—for our communities, residents and visitors, for businesses and charities, and for every endeavor that serves the common good.

Following the tradition of blessing farms, we invite you to bring soil from your farms/property for blessing at Masses on **Ascension Weekend, Saturday and Sunday (May 16 and 17)**, which you could later spread on your farms.
