Saint Bernard Abbot and Doctor of the Church

1090 - 1153

FEAST DAY: AUGUST 20

Known as Bernard of Clairvaux, this French abbot and doctor of the church is considered the second founder of the Cistercians. He entered the relatively new monastery at Citeaux in 1113 with four of his own brothers and 27 friends, and later founded the monastery at Clairvaux, which gave birth to 68 other communities. Despite poor health and his devotion to personal mortification, Bernard was an early Western European rock star: He was consulted by popes and kings, battled heresies, and supported the Second Crusade. The sick and maimed lined the roads he traveled, hoping for a miracle. Dante chose Bernard as his final guide in "Paradiso," at the end of "The Divine Comedy." He is the patron of Gibraltar.

Family Is Not Everything

I have often read in obituaries that “family was everything” for so-and-so. While no one condemns a natural love for one’s family, we are not thereby forced into accepting this obituarial creed without qualification. And Jesus could not make this point more clearly in today’s Gospel: “Do you think I have come to establish peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division... a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father...” etc. (Luke 12:51-53). Many other sayings of Our Lord make this same point:

“If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple” (Luke 14:26).

“Brother will deliver up brother to death, and the father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death; and you will be hated by all for my name’s sake” (Matthew 10:21).

“Truly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands, for my sake and for the gospel, who will not receive a hundredfold now... and in the age to come” (Mark 10:29).

Jesus also taught by example in how he put his mission above his familial ties, even distancing himself from his own Blessed Mother: ***“While he was still speaking to the people, behold, his mother and his brethren stood outside asking to speak to him. But he replied: “Who is my mother, and who are my brethren?” And stretching out his hand toward his disciples, he said, “Here are my mother and my brethren! For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother, and sister, and mother.” (Matthew 46-50).***

The last thing we wish to see is a family ruined by strife and discord. But even worse to see a God-fearing man or woman ruined because they fear family discord more than they fear God. Because they deem it less bitter to be at peace with their family and at enmity with God. St. Kateri Tekakwitha is an example to us in this regard. She had a great love for her family, but when they persisted in pressuring her to marry against her will, and when they became increasingly hostile towards her on account of her Christian faith, she decided to leave their village in order to live in a place where she could practice the Christian faith so dear to her heart – in freedom and peace. And she did leave. And she died there a few years later – separated from her blood relatives, surrounded by her family of Faith.

A family that prays together stays together – I pray you stay together in God; but I pray you stay with God and his son Jesus Christ, even if your family does not.

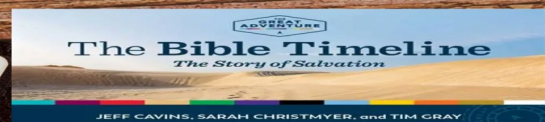
