THE SNORING OF A SAINT

Dear Parishioners,

Last Sunday I preached about Solomon's communication with God in a dream. I mentioned that it is possible, for one whose heart is pure, to continue "seeing" God even when we are asleep. I just finished reading a book about St. Francis Xavier and the following little story caught my attention since it hits upon the same theme. A fellow priest who worked for a time with St. Francis Xavier recounted:

For seven months I slept in the same room as he. He took only a very little sleep during which I frequently heard him sigh and invoke the holy name of Jesus. When I asked him why he sighed like that in his sleep, he answered: "***I don't know. I was not aware that I sighed.***"

Thus did the Saint snore so very sweetly. Most people's snoring is bothersome to us and even causes us to lose sleep because it slides under the surface of an agitated mind like a mouse slipping under the covers. It can drive us half mad and cause us to yell and even kick the ignorantly obnoxious disturber of our peace. Maybe next time you happen to be camping with some innocently disruptive boar, you can regain your peace by calling to mind the snoring of this Saint who sighed for Jesus even in his sleep. Or, perhaps if you are the snoring perpetrator yourself, you could pray that God would, after you snore through the inhalation, instead of whistling, make you sigh the name of Jesus on the exhalation, and thus, very likely, protect you from getting kicked. Because who could kick someone who devoutly sighs the name of Jesus in their sleep? I fear God would give them nightmares if they ever did catch a wink.

As he lay dying off the coast of China, in an unknown land, with only one faithful companion left, freezing and starving, St. Francis Xavier, in a fever, went in and out of delirium, often repeating: "***Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me.***" And with his last breath he said the name of Jesus. Thus did he speak when he was awake, when asleep, and when dying too. "If we have died with him, we know that we shall also rise with him," says St. Paul. If we have lived with him, we shall also sleep with him. Many of the Saints needed very little sleep. I think it is because when they sleep they rest with God who "gives strength to the weary, and increases the power of the weak" (Isaiah 40.29). We may not be great saints, but we can do this much: kneel down and say our prayers before bed — that God give us holy dreams, guard us from evil ones, and that if we should die before we wake, we pray God our souls to take. Amen.
