

## **Parish Information**



#### Fr. Glenn's Pen – 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday Year C

We continue through the book of Genesis, and we hear the beginning of the story about Sodom and Gomorrah. These towns were corrupt because of unnatural vice. If we practice the virtues, we become virtuous, but if we practice the vices we become vicious. God is so merciful and so patient with us. Our culture is so blinded by sin that it fails to grasp God's great love for us. I have come to believe that the only reason why something is sinful is because it is tremendously harmful to us. God has our best interest at heart. This long series of questions points the fact that God is patient and will spare the many for the benefit of the few.

So many in our world today have been conditioned to think, "Oh it really doesn't matter what you believe so long as you are a good person!" There certainly is some truth to this statement, but what does it mean to be a good person? There is a great battle between what is good and bad. What are our moorings? How do we choose to be guided in our discernment of what is good and bad? Where do we look? Pilate's question rings throughout the ages, "Truth, what does that mean?"

Sin is always destructive, and the bigger the sin the more destructive it is. For my part, I have chosen to believe that it is likely that the Church, that has endured waves of corruption and secular enemies that have tried to destroy her; from the Roman Empire to the atheistic socialistic and communistic regimes of today, she still survives! Jesus promised us that the gates of hell will not prevail against her (Mt 16:18) It seems likely that she has more insight into the true, the good, and the beautiful ,from her nearly 2000 years of experience than from my 62 years of lived experience!

I recall in one of the various modes of marriage preparation for couples over the years where they were asked share the most endearing quality of their future spouse? Each person shared what attracted them to their future spouse. When it came to me, I said, my spouse is the Church and her most endearing quality is that she is always right! There was laughter, but I have come to believe it to be so. The Church is right in her apostolic teaching, not in all her members who sometimes do not follow the demands of living the Gospel. To identify as a Christian is one thing, to truly live up to its demands is quite another thing. If one studies Church History it is rife with corruption in her members. We sadly have the experience in recent times. In 2018 even a cardinal betrayed his obligations in the most fundamental ways. It caused grave scandal and disgrace. Who knows how much damage his failures had caused to those who faith was wavering?

Paul reminds us that were buried in Christ through our baptism. Original sin was removed, and we were incorporated into His Mystical Body as Priest, Prophet and King. The 603 penitential laws were abrogated and brought us back to God's original intent to be a holy people, a people set apart who would follow His 10 commandments.

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches His disciples how to pray. We must forgive others as we would like to be forgiven! We also are called to come to the need of those around us. Faith assures us that God will give us all that we need. God sometimes says, "no" to our prayers, but that is because His "no" He knows what will help us much better than what we think we need. Know that God loves you and truly wants the best for you and will give us all that we need. May we be open enough to follow Jesus and His Church and draw others into His kingdom.




