

Fr. Glenn's Pen 18th Sunday Year C

The first reading is taken from Ecclesiastes and Qoheleth (the preacher) gives us a message, shall we say, that is less than optimistic. I think that one of the greatest aspects of the scripture which lends them credibility is the expression of deep human challenges that the authors experience. When we read the Psalms, for example, there are many different genres or types of psalms, there are psalms of lament and of praise. Psalm 51, for example, is a psalm that recognizes our great need for mercy. If these were composed only to get people to follow some myth it would seem more reasonable to not include the deep anguish that the believer will experience. Our God knows what we need and affords us opportunities which invite us to put our trust in Him rather than merely human guidance, or now some AI intelligence!


Today's psalm is pleading for God to help us understand God's ways and asking God to fill us with His kindness so that we may have joy and gladness all our days. It is a beautiful thing to ask God to help us and understand His ways. In my own personal journey, I can remember begging God to make me understand if He really wanted me to be His priest. I do not pretend to believe that I understand all that much, but I give God the credit for any understanding that I may have accrued.

Paul is writing to the Colossians to reflect on the higher things more than being consumed with earthly pursuits. Our sisters just renewed their vows on the Feast of St. Anne and Joachim, the parents of Mary. The religious take three vows, also known as three evangelical counsels, poverty, chastity and obedience. The call to poverty is ultimately not letting our possessions possess us! If we fail in this misfortune or a bad deal, it can bring great sorrow into our lives. We simply need basic things, but we must not allow ourselves to put things above God or our neighbor. God created us to love people and use things! Sadly, too many love things and use people!

Chastity is rooted in a purity of heart. Interestingly Aquinas points to the root of the word which is also the root for chastise. Paul mentions that we must "put to death" the part of our passions that are earthly! If you strive to live a holy life strive to gain custody of the mind. It is paramount for us to put good things into our senses. So many people spend hours on the internet each week, there are tremendously good things on the internet and also tremendously vile and evil things. Do not allow the content from the internet, movies or entertainment that is evil or vile enter your mind.

Obedience is rooted in Christ's example in the garden, "Father if this cup can pass from me so be it, but not my will but your will be done! This "new self" of which Paul speaks is intended to be for knowledge of God. God shows no favorites, God's ways are open to all, and Paul gives a list. This "new self" is always mindful of God's will, which will be for our best interest and the best interest of others!

The Gospel demonstrates how easy it is to get caught up in worldly pursuits. In Catholic Social teaching, the business owner is not concerned with how little he can pay his employees without "sinning" but rather attempts to discern how much he can pay them without endangering the solvency of the company. We should not be worried about how much money we can amass, but, rather, on how well we use our resources for the service of God and others. The Gospel is demonstrating how important it is to be good stewards. If God has given us the aptitude to be good at business we have a moral obligation to use our resources to help those who have less and to glorify God in all that we do!






