

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

This weekend we celebrate a very ancient feast in the Catholic Church, The Triumph of the Cross! I suspect you know the story that Constantine was in a battle, his mother Helena was a Christian and may have had some influence, but as the story goes Constantine had received a vision around 312 AD before the Battle of the Milvian Bridge, which instructed him "In hoc signo vinces" which means "by this sign you will conquer"! The sign was the Chi Rho, the two Greek letters for the first two Greak letters for Christ. He had won the battle and that set the stage for him to consolidate his power as the Roman Emperor. Shortly thereafter in 313 with the Edict of Milan he made Christianity legal, and Christians no longer feared the threat of persecution. Some years later, his mother discovered the true Cross. It was determined to be the true cross because there were miraculous healings associated with those who touch this particular cross rather that others that were also discovered.

How easy it is for us to complain? Most of us are not too aware of God's working, even in the little things in our lives. It is so easy for me to take such things for granted. In the book of Numbers we hear about the people's complaint about the food (the miraculous manna) that is sustaining them. God had delivered them from cruel generational slavery and yet they complain. It can be hard when we are faced with our daily crosses to lose our optimism and give into negativity. God loves them too much to let them persist in their complaints. He sends seraph serpents to afflict them. Many died and they begged God to take them away. He effectively instructs them to look at a bronze serpent fashioned by Moses by God's instruction. Those who looked upon the serpent lived. This image has been used to foreshadow the event of Jesus being lifted up so that those who looked upon Him would be saved.

The Psalmist again implores us to be ready for God to open His mouth in a parable and thus reveal the mysteries of old. God is truly to be our rock, our foundation. God always forgives those who sincerely seek His mercy!

Many years ago, there was a book called The DaVinci Code. It claimed that it was fiction, but then went on to claim that the early Christians did not believe Jesus was God until the 300's. Paul's letter to the Phillipians pretty much debunks such a fallacious claim. The philosophical term "form" for the Greeks related to the very essence of a thing. The "form" is essential to identity and clearly Paul is stating that Jesus is God. This was likely written around 50 AD. Jesus' divinity was clearly an early belief.

The Gospel simply states Jesus' explanation to Nicodemus that Jesus would be lifted up so that everyone who looked upon Him would be saved. May we all gaze upon Jesus so that we may be transformed and bring others with us to eternal glory!

Artists invited to participate in second annual Art Exhibition Festival




