

Fr. Glenn's Pen: All Souls Day

Once every seven years All Souls Day falls on a Sunday, so instead of the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time, the readings are selected from the funeral readings that the Church uses, St. Odilo of Cluny in the 10th century. The point was to standardize November 2 as a day to pray for all those souls in Purgatory.

The Catholic Church understands her manifestation in three aspects, the Church Triumphant, (those in Heaven), the Church Suffering (those souls in Purgatory), and finally the Church Militant (that is us, those who are still engaged in the battle for souls, our soul and the souls of others).

Funeral readings are taken from both the Old Testament (the Hebrew Scriptures), and also from the New Testament. The Old Testament points to the New Testament as fulfilled in Christ, while the New Testament reveals the deeper meaning behind the Jewish Scriptures. For example, the Jewish people were "Passed over" because of the blood of an unblemished male lamb!

These readings are taken from the Catholic Canon of the Bible. There is a beautiful reading from the book of Wisdom which reminds us to see that death is not the end, but rather that "the souls of the just are in the hand of God and no torment will touch them". It certainly suggests that those faithful souls are in an eternal realm, not sleeping, but still not in heaven, properly speaking. Sheol would be the Hebrew word that describes such a place. Those faithful were awaiting Jesus to open the gates of heaven. Another reading taken from Isaiah suggests that God's plan includes all of humanity, all the nations of the earth, not just the Jewish people.

The New Testament points to the fulfillment of the Hebrew Scriptures in Christ. Paul in 1 Thessalonians reminds the Christians that we do not grieve like the rest. We still grieve, and the more perfect our love is for someone, the deeper we grieve when we lose them, but we are filled with hope knowing that death is not the end.

The Gospel shares the true story of our salvation which entails our faith in the resurrection. We truly live forever. When we truly believe this, it gives us hope because of our flesh. Death has no power over us. This is our faith but this is not easy to grasp. Let us pray for all those who have gone before us. If they are in Purgatory, our prayers matter! If they are already in heaven, we can apply those prayers who are in need of them.




