

## **Parish Information**



#### Fr. Glenn's Pen – 45h Sunday of Advent – Year A

Many years ago, probably about 25, I was talking to a young man who had attended the same public school that I had attended in the late 70's and early 80's. Somehow we got on the topic of religion. He was quick to share that he was taught that all religions have their "resurrection myths". Implying that there was nothing really unique about the Christian story. I fear this was the seed that led this person away from the faith. Many young people where drawn away from Christianity by the secular educational system. Even in my day some of the Catholic Schools did not seem to grasp the importance of their singular mission to proclaim the Good News of Christ. I was brought up in a family that never took faith for granted. I recall when we would have company, the standard parting greeting was, "Keep the faith!" When I was a young child, one of the priests was visiting our home and as he was leaving I said "Keep the faith!"; my family was aghast that I said that to a priest! I know firsthand that priests especially need to hear such a greeting. Faith has been under assault!

Advent is a time for us to focus on the great mystery of our faith. It is not just like any other religion; it has tremendously strong historical provenance. Genesis 3:15, known as the protoevangelium – the first Gospel, after the fall, God spoke to satan and said, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, your offspring and hers. You will strike at their heel, and they will crush your head!" The pronouns in Hebrew are tricky, sometimes it is translated that "you will strike at her heel, and she will crush your head", others say, "you will strike at His heel and He will crush your head". It is impossible to tell from the Hebrew, so the translation I used was from a Jewish translation of the Old Testament.

We hear many other prophecies that speak of the coming Messiah in the line of David. I do not believe there is any other world religious figure that has anything like the prophecies concerning Jesus. Isiah actually gives this child a name that literally means, "God is with us!"

Paul reminds the Romans that Jesus came not only from the David line but came to bring all people together, Jew and Gentile alike. In the Gospel we hear about the birth of Jesus and how God let Joseph know that all is well. We hear Joseph described as a "righteous man". We do not have even one word from Joseph in the Bible, but this description says a lot. A Jewish rabbi had a friend who was a priest and read this account about Joseph to be "just". He commented that this describes possibly a certain kind of Jewish man, "a Zedek", "a just one. He noted that sometimes such a man had dedicated his life to study and may have made a Deuteronomic vow, which sometimes included celibacy. He would have likely known several languages, possibly Egyptian, quite handy for the flight into Egypt. Nonetheless, God uses us all to share this good news which truly has singular historical provenance. Come Lord Jesus Come! Maranatha!
