

Saint Therese Church To Know, To Love, To Serve

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

Fr. Glenn's Pen – The Feast of the Holy Family

We have just celebrated the glorious feast of Our Lord's birth into the world. God has revealed Himself in the flesh! In this first weekend after Christmas and before the Epiphany, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. God chose to reveal Himself in the context of a human family. This family is the model for us to emulate. In His Sacred Scriptures God had given us real instruction on what such a family would look like!

The first reading from Sirach gives us the attitudes which each family member is to aspire. The challenge is that we are all free creatures and we fail to accept the grace God gives us to live up to these ideals. A father is "set in honor over his children; a mother's authority He confirms over her sons." We are called to have profound reverence for our parents, and if we do so he or she "atones for sins". One thing that our parents gave us is life, our life was brought about in cooperation with God's providence. No matter how perfect or imperfect our parents may be, we must honor them. Foolishly as a youth I thought, "Why doesn't the world constantly improve? We can learn from the mistakes our parents made and not make them!" Well, children do not come with an instruction manual as to how to take care of them! Each human is so different. In fact, I really appreciate what Fr. Spitzer says in his book, *The Souls upward yearning for Transcendence*", - something to the effect, "every human being is a universe unto themselves" He goes on to suggest that the "physics" aka science will work in another galaxy should we be able to travel there some day, but each human operates under their own universal laws. Make no mistake, there are commonalities, but everyone is unique. At some point in our life we have to ask ourselves the question, "Do I follow Christ because my parents did?" or "Do I follow Christ because I believe He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life".

Paul enjoins the Colossians to put into practice the implications of following Christ. "Put on ... heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another... as the Lord has forgiven you, so you must do!" ... above all "put on love, that is the bond of perfection". To walk the virtuous life, we must strive to gain custody of our thoughts. I enjoin you to beg to respond to the grace God gives you, in the way that He wants you to respond to that grace! I try and pray for this everyday in my personal prayer. In Paul's letter to the Ephesians, he enjoins spouses to "subjugate" yourselves to one another. Christians are called to a life of service. All vocations epitomize service in different ways. In marriage this "subjugation" must be mutual. Both spouses must truly discern what is best for the other. John Paul II had deep insight on how this can be done in what is called his "Theology of the Body".

Here is my "nickel" summary of it. We all want three things, pleasure, possessions, and power! The war rages within us to be either the person of lust, or the person who is pure of heart. The person of lust wants pleasure, possessions and power in a narcissistic self-serving way. The person with a pure heart wants to bring pleasure to their spouse, use their possessions to serve God and neighbor, and to use their authority in a way that benefits those who are subject to it. May we strive for this purity of heart!

The Holy family models how we should live our lives. May we respond to God's grace and do it!


