BGCMS provides safe environments for youth to explore societal and personal values, develop new ways of communicating their perspectives, and increase their capacity to understand others. That's why, in addition to providing healthy meals, wellness education, and daily physical activity, we provide our members with targeted social-emotional learning and developmental support while embedding "SEL" strategies into all of our programs.

While we strive to ensure our Clubs are safe havens for youth, both physically and emotionally, we recognize that the hours our youth spend outside of our Clubhouse walls are often marked by uncertainty and rapid change. That's why it's also crucial that our Clubs work to teach our youth how to make healthy decisions beyond our blue doors.

This year, our **Youth Resource Directors** provided Club members with critical support services and programs designed to enhance their Club experience and support their overall well-being, while also providing essential training to our staff team to ensure that all Club staff are equipped with the principles of trauma-informed care.

Our goals for our youth go beyond academic achievement, focusing on cultivating essential life skills like emotional intelligence, teamwork, perseverance, communication, problem-solving, and engagement. At BGCMS, we believe that true youth development encompasses the social and emotional growth of our young people, supporting the holistic well-being of each child!

KIDS THESE DAYS DESERVE THRIVING COMMUNITIES.

We've doubled down on our commitment to expanding our impact beyond our Clubhouse doors by launching our new **Blue Spoon Community Kitchen**, a hub for meal service, nutrition education, and community collaboration located adjacent to our Taunton Clubhouse in downtown Taunton.



On September 11th, we officially cut the ribbon on our new 2,700 sq.ft **Blue Spoon Community Kitchen** in the heart of downtown Taunton, which provides a central space for our Clubs to prepare and serve nearly 150,000 healthy, nutritious meals to youth and families each year!

BGCMS operates a robust suite of nutritional assistance programs and initiatives – many of which are blazing new trails of innovation and setting the pace for partnership to drive collective impact. The Blue Spoon greatly expands our capacity to collaborate and innovate – helping us further connect our Clubs with other organizations working to reduce food insecurity and build healthy, resilient futures.

Rental options also ensure this game-changing commercial kitchen facility is available to local nutritional assistance organizations, culinary entrepreneurs, students, and other members of the community who we can empower through our "rising tides" approach to collective impact.

Representing a profound investment in our region's longterm health and resilience, the Blue Spoon also provides unique educational opportunities to Club kids and teens as the new home for our "Young Chefs" program, wherin youth learn key principles about nutrition and practice preparing delicious, balanced meals that can be replicated at home.

We continue to rely on our committed volunteers who lend their time and talents to these <u>critical programs</u>. Thank you!

As she heads off to college this fall, Kizzy will continue her Club journey on school breaks and in the summer as a lifeguard, swim instructor, and camp counselor!









Upon completing a dynamic skill-building educational curriculum, program participants are placed in age-Clubhouses where they support and learn directly from Club staff they know and trust. As members gain transferable skills and experience, the program shifts to external placements with corporate and community world, paid experiences outside of the Clubhouse.

Our Clubs are constantly working to forge and strengthen dynamic partnerships with local schools, businesses, and of existing community partners, including our local school districts and area colleges and universities like Stonehill College, Bridgewater State University, and Massasoit & Bristol Community Colleges to help create real-world experiential opportunities for our youth.

A national survey found that 80% of alumni said their Club experience had a positive impact on their attitude towards fitness and health and 77% said they developed good leadership skills as Club members.




