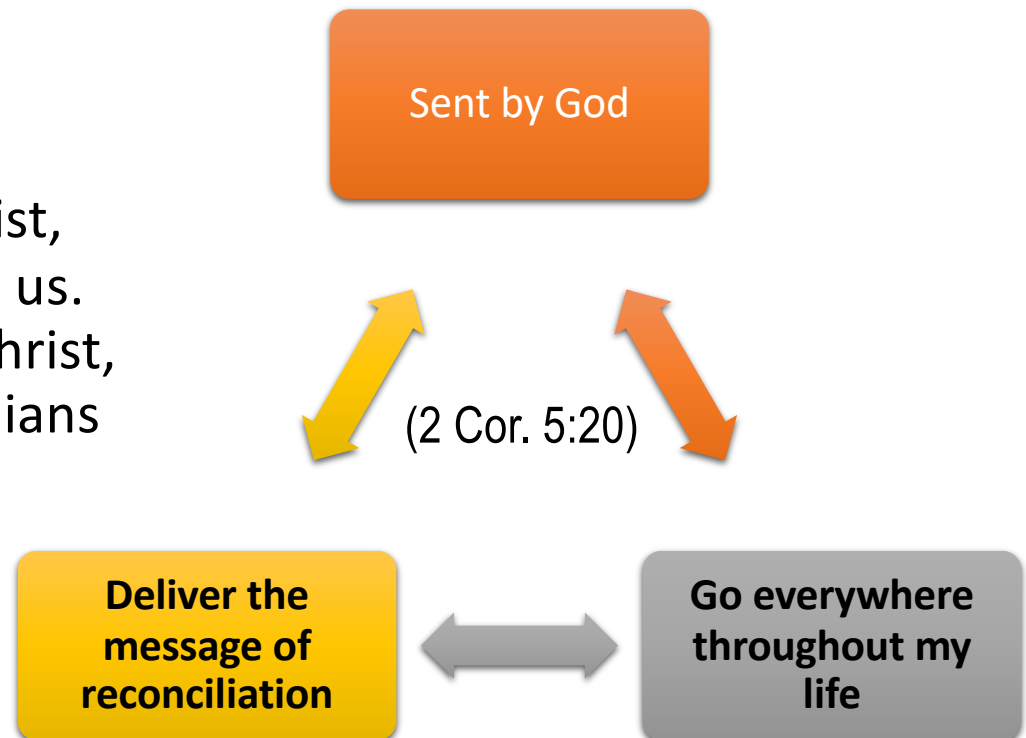

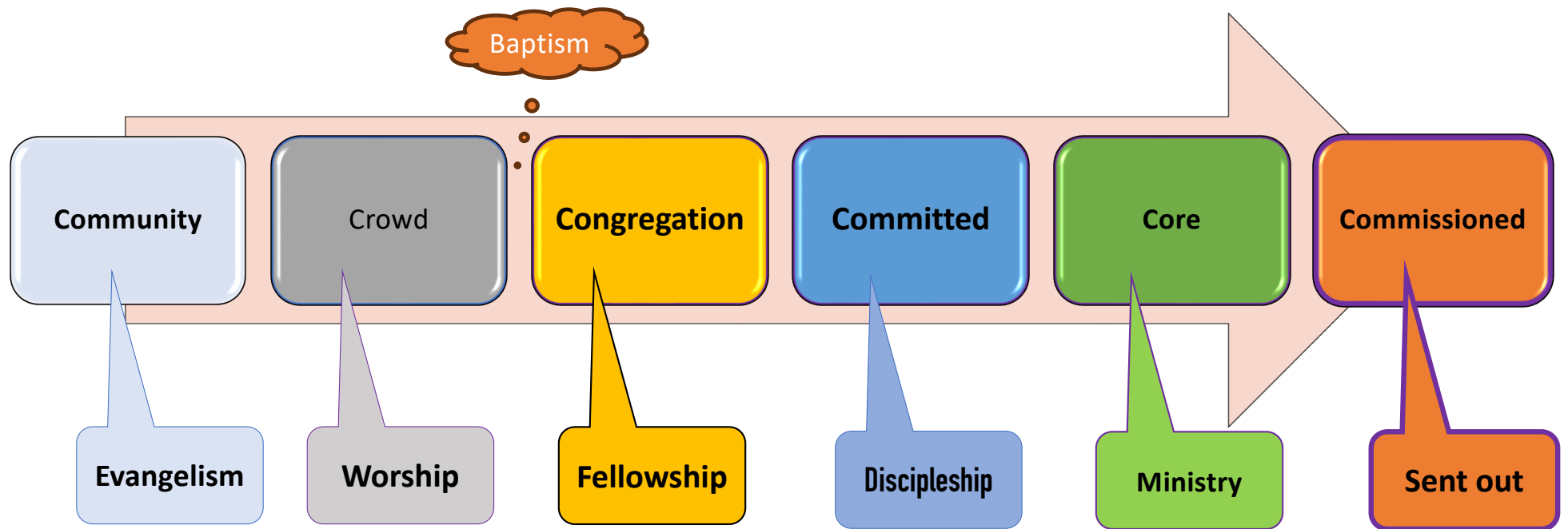


# Christ's Ambassador Model

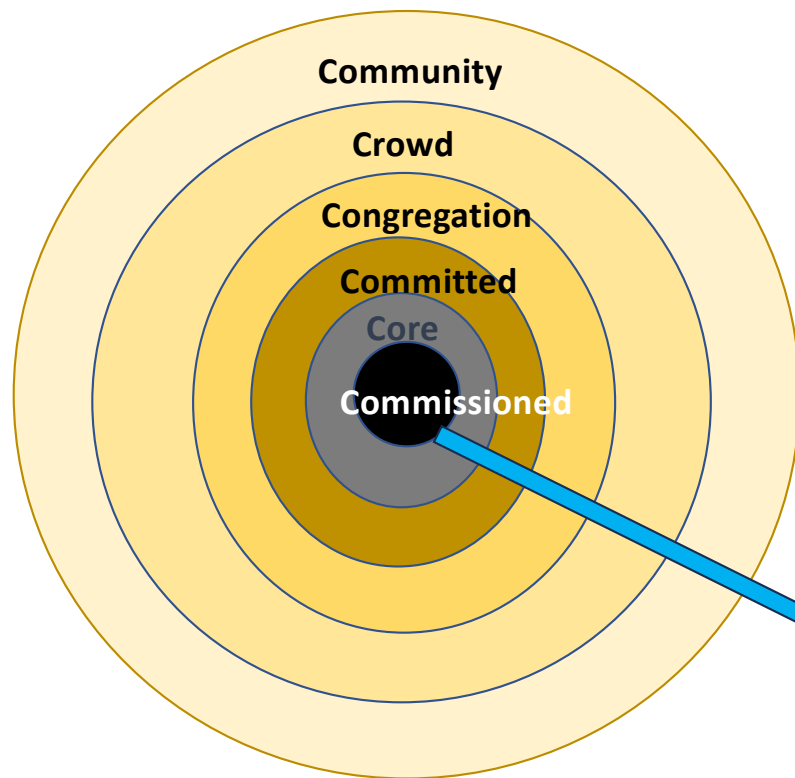
- So we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We beseech you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God (2 Corinthians 5:20)



# Different Strategies Needed to Each Target



# Identify the Target




<b>The Community</b>	<b>The uncommitted people who live within your ministry area</b>
<b>The Crowd</b>	<b>The people who are committed to attending worship each week</b>
<b>The Congregation</b>	<b>Those who have committed to membership</b>
<b>The Committed</b>	<b>Those who have committed to maturity</b>
<b>The Core</b>	<b>Those who have committed to ministry</b>
<b>The Commissioned</b>	<b>Those who have committed to their mission</b>

# Church is called to work globally

- God shows love to all
  - God loves the world... (John 3:16)
  - God wants all people to be saved and to come to the truth (1 Tim 2:4)
  - There before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the Lamb (Revelation 7:9).
- God expects us to go
  - **Go!** This man is my chosen instrument to carry my name before the Gentiles and their kings and before the people of Israel (Acts 9:15)
  - **Go,** stand in the temple court and tell the people the full message of this new life (Acts 5:20)
  - **Go** to the great city of Nineveh and preach against it, because its wickedness has come before me (Jonah 1:2)
  - Now **go.** I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt (Exodus 3:10)

The word "**Go**" appears 1542 times in the Bible. God wants you to "go" and live out his plan for your life.

### The importance of the world mission

- (God said): It's not a big enough job for my servant just to recovery your own people, I'm setting you up as **a light for the nations**, so that my salvation become global (Isaiah 49:6, MSG)

### Shifting to a global Christian

- Self-centered thinking -> other-centered thinking
- Local thinking -> global thinking
- Here and now thinking -> eternal thinking
- Thinking of excuses -> thinking to creative ways to fulfill God's commission

# Building a Mission Church

- A mission church actively envisions, equips, and mobilizes its people for mission
  - The key strategy of a missional church is focusing on 'going out' rather than 'bringing in.'
- Key words in activating people for mission
  - **Envisioning**: Pastor casts the vision for mission.
  - **Equipping**: Practical, hands-on training for people in the church on how to do mission and be involved in mission.
  - **Mobilizing**: Those who have been envisioned for mission and equipped for mission are deployed in mission.

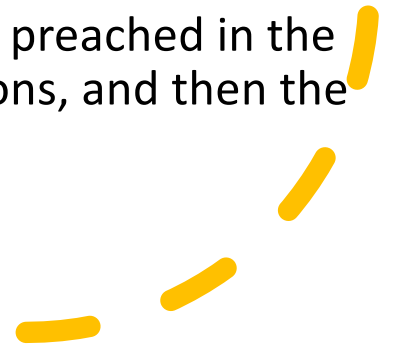
# The Commissioned

---

- Who are commissioned?
  - The big goal for moving people from the community all the way to the core is ultimately to **send them back** out again to reach more of the community.
  - When people are commissioned, we should be preparing them to be sent out on mission.
- The goal of the church
  - Church leaders must be intentional about creating pathways for people to grow from one level of commitment to the next until they are commissioned.
  - A healthy church finds ways to move people from where they are to where God wants them to be in their spiritual journey.

# The Importance of the commissioned

- It is a continuation of Jesus' mission on earth.
- It is a wonderful privilege.
- It is the greatest thing you can do for others.
- It has eternal significance.
- It gives your life meaning.
- It is connected to God's timetable for history's conclusion.
- And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come (Matt 24:14).



# Sending out your Commissioned on Mission

- Jesus was most concerned about our mission

The night before His crucifixion	As you sent me into the world, I have sent them <b>into the world</b> (John 17:18).
After His resurrection	Therefore go and make disciples <b>of all nations</b> , baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age (Matthew 28:19-20).
Before His ascension	But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to <b>the ends of the earth</b> (Acts 1:8).

# Roles of the Commissioned

- Mission is to “work at bringing others to Christ.” (2 Timothy 4:5, NLT)
- Go everywhere in the world, and tell the good news to everyone (Mark 16:15, NCV).
- To whom? Everyone
  - Go at once into the streets and alleys of the town, and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind, and the lame... and go out to the roads and lanes, and urge all the people to come so My house will be full. (Luke 14:21-23, NCV).
- When? Right now
  - The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, "We have found the Messiah". And he brought him to Jesus. (John 1:40-42, NIV).
- How? With commonality
  - Whatever a person is like, I try to find common ground with him so that he will let me tell him about Christ and let Christ save him. (1 Corinthians 9:22, LB).

# God's promises for the Commissioned

- He directs your way
  - I am the Lord your God, who teaches you what is best for you, who directs you in the way you should go (Isaiah 48:17).
- He protects you
  - No man will be able to stand against you. The Lord your God, as he promised you, will put the terror and fear of you on the whole land, wherever you go (Deuteronomy 11:25).
- He guards you
  - The Lord will go before you; the God of Israel will be your rear guard (Isaiah 52:12).
