

The liturgy (our worship service) comes from Scripture. The whole service is ordered and designed to use God's Word to bring praise and thanks and glory to God. The earliest Christian churches gathered to pray, to hear teaching, and to partake in the bread and the wine of Holy Communion.

All who are baptized in the name of the Triune God, believe in the real presence of Jesus in the bread and the wine of Holy Communion, and are repentant of their sins are welcome at the Lord's Table.

A Message on this Third Sunday of Advent from Pastor Justin Baker

"Are you the one who is to come or shall we seek another?"

What a strange question that John's messengers send Jesus! John, the same one who called Jesus "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" -- his own cousin! -- now seems to have doubts.

Jesus response outlines his ministry: "the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them."

Why is this his response? Because this is what Jesus promised to do at the beginning of his ministry. Immediately after the Temptation, Jesus enters a synagogue, picks up the scroll of Isaiah, and tells the people that *he* is the one whom Isaiah foretold. Jesus' ministry and mission is singularly focused on *undoing death* – on undoing the death of sight and sound and skin and body and favor. All that blights the body and soul will come to an end. Jesus will destroy death.

Jesus turns next to the ministry of John, reinforcing and reminding the people that John is the one who was to come to prepare his way. John's ministry – which is at the heart of his question to Jesus – has not been a failure, because he has prepared the way for the Christ.

Most Holy God, allot to us each a portion of ministry, and enable us to be faithful to you and fruitful in our work, to the glory of your Holy Name, in the Name of Jesus, Amen. Confession will be led from the altar and there will be no procession during advent.





THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The First Lesson Isaiah 40:1-8

A reading from Isaiah, beginning with the fortieth chapter.

¹Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

²Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her

that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned,

that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

The Second Lesson

1 Corinthians 4:1-5

A reading from First Corinthians, beginning with the fourth chapter.

¹This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. ²Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful. ³But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by any human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself. ⁴For I am not aware of anything against myself, but I am not thereby acquitted. It is the Lord who judges me. ⁵Therefore do not pronounce judgment before the time, before the Lord comes, who will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Then each one will receive his commendation from God.

Children's Sermon

P Matthew records this about the greatest in the kingdom of heaven:

18 At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" ² And calling to him a child, he put him in the midst of them ³ and said, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. ⁴ Whoever humbles himself like this child

is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

⁵Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, ⁶but whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened around his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea."

All little ones – and any others – are invited forward for a message and for prayer.

When the children's sermon is concluded, the people stand for the hymn and remain standing for the Holy Gospel.

"'Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way before you.'




Preface for Sundays in Advent

Eucharistic Canon

P Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father:

Endless is your mercy and eternal your reign. You have filled all creation with light and life; heaven and earth are full of your glory. Through Abraham you promised to bless all nations. You rescued Israel, your chosen people.

Through the prophets you renewed your promise; and, at this end of all the ages, you sent your Son, who in words and deeds proclaimed your kingdom and was obedient to your will, even to giving his life.

In the night in which He was betrayed Our Lord Jesus took bread and gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying:

Take and eat; this is my Body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, He took the cup, gave thanks; and gave it for all to drink, saying:

This cup is the new covenant in my Blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

- P Therefore, gracious Father, with this bread and cup we remember the life our Lord offered for us. And, believing the witness of his resurrection, we await his coming in power to share with us the great and promised feast.

- P Send now, we pray, your Holy Spirit, the spirit of our Lord and of his resurrection, that we who receive the Lord's body and blood may live to the praise of your glory and receive our inheritance with all your saints in light.
- Amen. Come, Holy Spirit.
- P Join our prayers with those of your servants of every time and every place, and unite them with the ceaseless petitions of our great high priest until he comes as victorious Lord of all.
- Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father, now and forever. Amen
- P Lord, remember us in your kingdom, and teach us to pray:
- Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us;


and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Our Practice of Holy Communion

St. Paul writes: "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup." (1 Corinthians 11:27–28, ESV)

Not one of us is worthy *on our own merit* to receive our Lord Jesus. Nevertheless, he bids us to come to him all the same (Matthew 11:28-30). And so, trusting his great mercy, anyone may come to him in faith, having examined oneself according to this confession:

All who are baptized in the name of the Triune God, believe in the real presence of Jesus in the bread and the wine of Holy Communion, and are repentant of their sins are welcome at the Lord's Table.

All others may come forward for a blessing, signaling this by crossing your arms over your chest.






