A Message on this Feast of Holy Innocents

¹³ Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him."

We don't know much about Joseph. And yet, this is now the second recorded time that an angel has appeared to Joseph in a dream. This reminds us of that earlier, ancient Joseph, who also had dreams.

The patriarch Joseph's dreams led him to the position to save his father, Israel. Now, Joseph is the father who saves his son – the promised son of Israel. Without Joseph the patriarch and his dreams, the people of Israel would be lost. Without Joseph the father of Jesus and his dreams, the people of Israel would also be lost.

The murder of the innocents reminds us of that earlier murder – the murder by Pharoah of the Hebrew infants. The reality is that evil will not go down without a fight, without revealing how evil evil is. But that is why Jesus comes – so that evil puts an end to itself by putting Jesus to death.

Holy God, protect us and keep us from evil, that we may honor you, Amen.


Preface for Christmas
