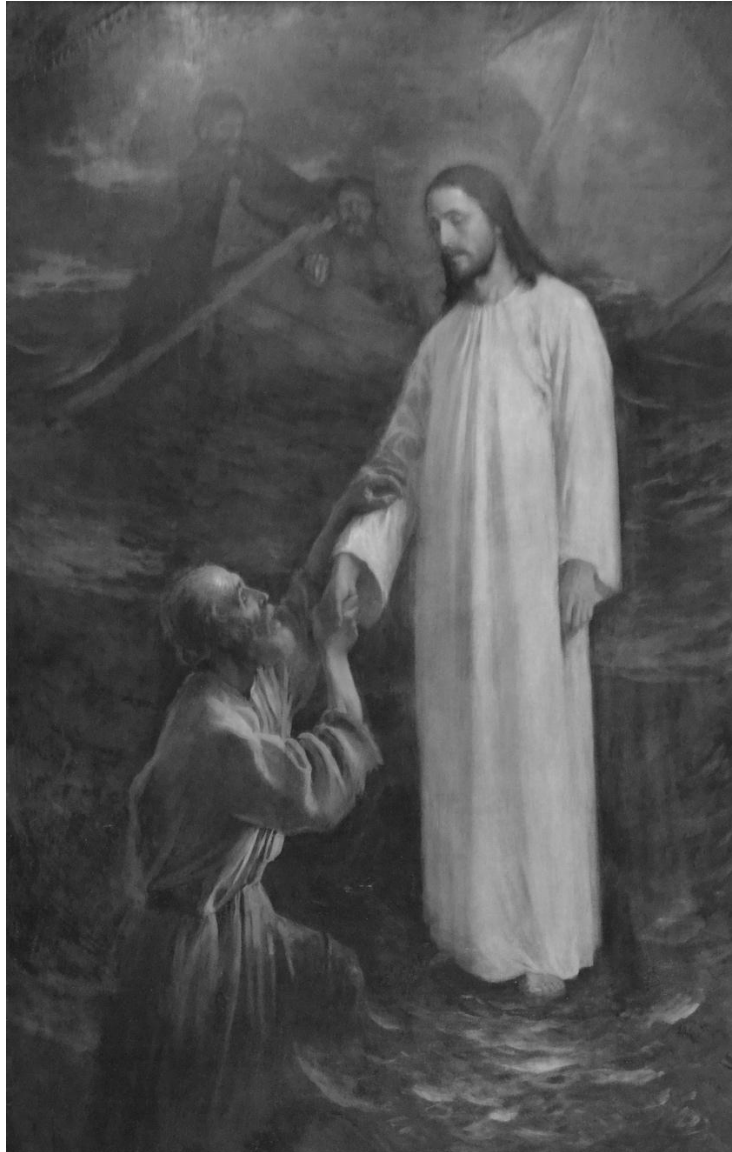

## **A Message on this Second Sunday after the Epiphany**

*"And on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?"*

This is the most important question that every single person in the universe must answer. The crowd believes Jesus is very important – perhaps Jesus John the Baptist, or Elijah, or one of the prophets. They understand that Jesus is from God. But they still do not understand who he is.

Only St. Peter gives Jesus all the credit he is due – Jesus is *"the Christ."* Christ is loaded with prophetic meaning and hope. He is the one who will be the King of the Jews, the one who will save his people from their sins, the one who will establish an everlasting kingdom.

So, too, many in our day believe that Jesus was nice, or good, but cannot muster the humility to assign to Jesus all that he is due – all worship, all honor, all glory, all praise – for he is the Christ, the Son of God. Let us not be counted among those who do not give Jesus our full confidence & faith.

*Holy God, bless us with the faith of Saint Peter, that we may be blessed with faith in your Son, in whose Name we pray, Amen.*

## The Second Lesson

## 2 Peter 1:1-15

*A reading from Second Peter, beginning with the first chapter.*

<sup>1</sup> Simeon Peter, a servant and apostle of Jesus Christ,

To those who have obtained a faith of equal standing with ours by the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ:

<sup>2</sup> May grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord.

<sup>3</sup> His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence, <sup>4</sup> by which he has granted to us his precious and very great promises, so that through them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire. <sup>5</sup> For this very reason, make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge, <sup>6</sup> and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, <sup>7</sup> and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love. <sup>8</sup> For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>9</sup> For whoever lacks these qualities is so nearsighted that he is blind, having forgotten that he was cleansed from his former sins. <sup>10</sup> Therefore, brothers, be all the more diligent to confirm your calling and election, for if you practice these qualities you will never fall. <sup>11</sup> For in this way there will be richly provided for you an entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

<sup>12</sup> Therefore I intend always to remind you of these qualities, though you know them and are established in the truth that you have. <sup>13</sup> I think it right, as long as I am in this body, to stir you up by way of reminder, <sup>14</sup> since I know that the putting off of my body will be soon, as our Lord Jesus Christ made clear to me. <sup>15</sup> And I will make every effort so that after my departure you may be able at any time to recall these things.






