## **A Message on this Third Sunday of Easter**

*Jesus is the Good Shepherd.*

Other shepherds come and go, and they care nothing for the sheep. But things are different now — the good shepherd has come. He loves his sheep; he cares for them. But there's more: he's the one through whom the sheep were made.

Before the foundation of the world, before there were sheep or streams or pastures or shepherds, Jesus *is* the Good Shepherd. (Yes, I mean present tense there.) He was always going to come for his sheep, even before they were born, even before they were created.

For this shepherd is no man; he is the Son of God, come to his people, the sheep of his pasture. Thanks be to God for that Jesus is our Shepherd!

## *Our Practice of Holy Communion*

St. Paul writes: "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup." (1 Corinthians 11:27–28, ESV)

Not one of us is worthy *on our own merit* to receive our Lord Jesus. Nevertheless, he bids us to come to him all the same (Matthew 11:28-30). And so, trusting his great mercy, anyone may come to him in faith, having examined oneself according to this confession:

*All who are baptized in the name of the Triune God, believe in the real presence of Jesus in the bread and the wine of Holy Communion, and are repentant of their sins are welcome at the Lord's Table.*

All others may come forward for a blessing, signaling this by crossing your arms over your chest.






