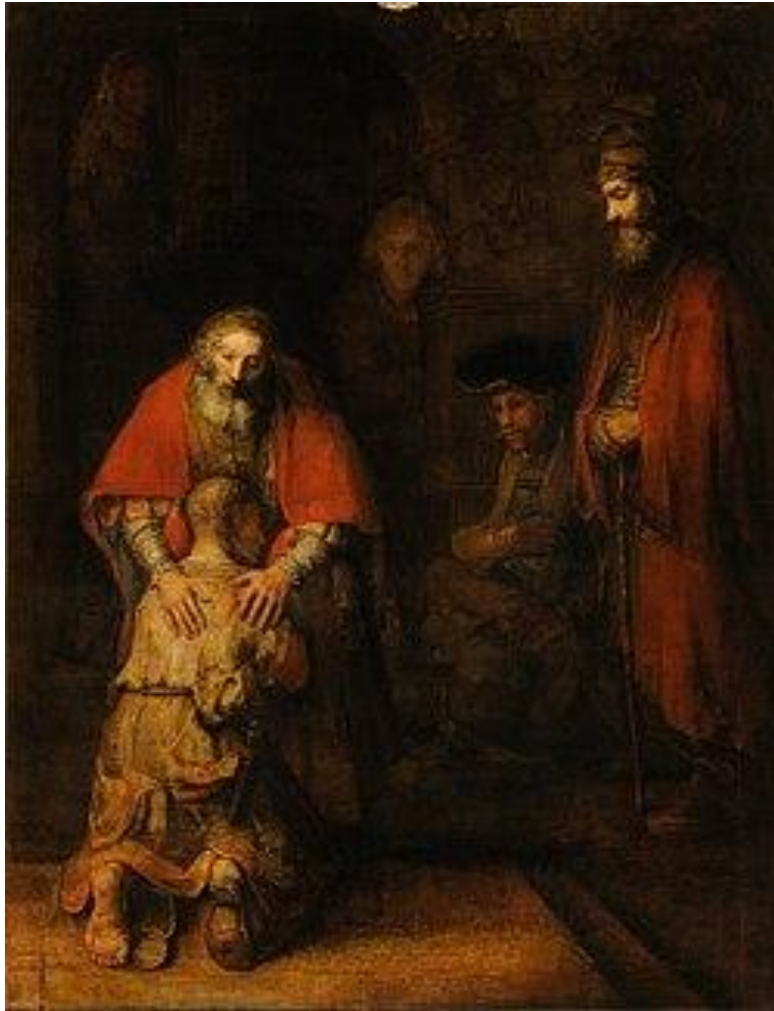

On this Fourth Sunday after Pentecost

Unto Thee, O LORD, do I lift up my soul. O my God, I trust in Thee: let me not be ashamed. (Psalm 25:1–2a)

This morning's passage reminds us where we all belong. Whether we have remained faithful in the Lord's house for life, or whether we have departed and now returned, his house is where we belong.

There is nowhere else on earth that the prodigal son will find fortune and family; there is nowhere else in the world to come where we will find such things except through faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

The parable of the prodigal son reveals the extraordinary grace that this father has for his son. It's obviously about the love that *the Father* has for his children—you and me—all who have, at times, abandoned him. But at the time, the implication is also clear: there's nowhere else this son will ever want to be again than in his father's house. He has come home. May all such people, who have abandoned their Lord and their faith, return home.

Holy God, Father, Son, & Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, now and forever, Amen.





Our Practice of Holy Communion

St. Paul writes: “Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup.” (1 Corinthians 11:27–28, ESV)

Not one of us is worthy *on our own merit* to receive our Lord Jesus. Nevertheless, he bids us to come to him all the same (Matthew 11:28-30). And so, trusting his great mercy, anyone may come to him in faith, having examined oneself according to this confession:

All who are baptized in the name of the Triune God, believe in the real presence of Jesus in the bread and the wine of Holy Communion, and are repentant of their sins are welcome at the Lord’s Table.

All others may come forward for a blessing, signaling this by crossing your arms over your chest.

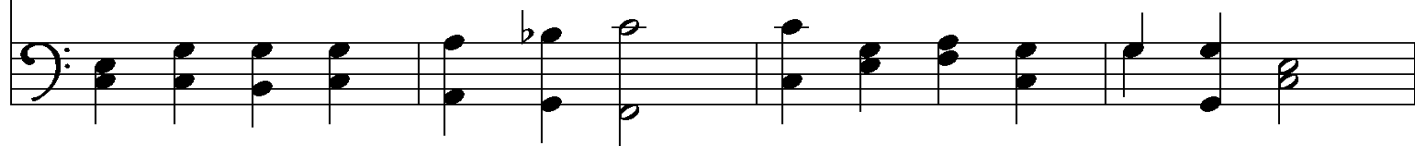
