On this Fifth Sunday after Pentecost

Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit?

A blind man cannot lead blind men; an unrighteous man cannot lead the unrighteous into righteousness. So it is very good that the One who has the power to make even the blind see has come. For he makes the blind see, and the unrighteous, righteous.

And so Jesus has come, bringing the wisdom of eternity with him, and he who is the judge of all things—the one who will judge our souls on the last day—tells his disciples, “Judge not.”

Our culture tends to interpret this saying as if *sin* no longer matters, or as if we are not supposed to say that sin is sin, that wrong is wrong, and that evil is evil. Not so. Just before the ascension, our Lord sends his disciples out proclaiming *repentance for the forgiveness of sins*. This is not about ignoring sin.

What then? We are not to judge ourselves *better* than others, even when they seem to be much worse sinners than us. Did we not also *need* God's forgiveness? What right do we have to withhold it from *them*?

Holy God, Father, Son, & Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, now and forever, Amen.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The First Lesson

Genesis 50:15-21

¹⁵ When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him." ¹⁶ So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this command before he died: ¹⁷ 'Say to Joseph, "Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you.'" And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. ¹⁸ His brothers also came and fell down before him and said, "Behold, we are your servants." ¹⁹ But Joseph said to them, "Do not fear, for am I in the place of God? ²⁰ As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. ²¹ So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones." Thus he comforted them and spoke kindly to them.





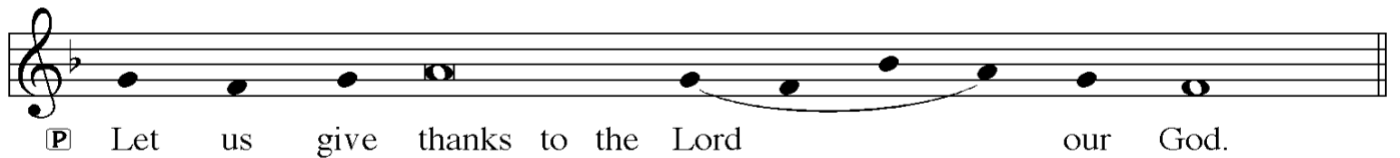

Our Practice of Holy Communion

St. Paul writes: “Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup.” (1 Corinthians 11:27–28, ESV)

Not one of us is worthy *on our own merit* to receive our Lord Jesus. Nevertheless, he bids us to come to him all the same (Matthew 11:28-30). And so, trusting his great mercy, anyone may come to him in faith, having examined oneself according to this confession:

All who are baptized in the name of the Triune God, believe in the real presence of Jesus in the bread and the wine of Holy Communion, and are repentant of their sins are welcome at the Lord’s Table.

All others may come forward for a blessing, signaling this by crossing your arms over your chest.
