

Greetings Saints of Emmanuel:

The Advent of our King is at hand.

As the light of day continues to wane until the winter solstice, as darkness reaches its zenith, we tread through the Advent season, remembering that Christ *will come* again and that we *will need* to be ready.

One of the most terrifying passages in all of Scripture is the parable of the ten virgins with oil lamps; five have plenty of oil, five have run out. (See Matthew 25:1-13). The five, knowing they have run out, leave to go fill their lamps. But when they return, it is already too late. They will not be let into the feast.

Keeping the faith is serious business. Christ will come again. Yes, perhaps, even today, for we may have missed the signs of his coming.

Let it not be so with us. We are to be ready, having stockpiled faith, that it may be always full to the brim and running over, that we may not be caught *faithless* at our Lord's return.

Precious treasure and oil are in a wise man's dwelling,
but a foolish man devours it. ~ *Proverbs 21:20*

We do not live in an inert, meaningless world. As I wrote in our *Daniel Study*:

Worship of God is not inert. That is, it matters if you do it, and it matters if you don't do it. There are blessings for obedience; there are curses for disobedience.

The Parable of the Sower reminds us that there are those who hear the Word, rejoice, and nevertheless still fall away. That is, they believe that Jesus has been raised from the dead, they believe in the forgiveness of sins, and then, they either stop caring or simply find other things to be more worthy of their time and their lives.

There are many such things that are at first, but a distraction to our faith -- our work, our family, bills, this "small" sin here, this worry there, and so on. We convince ourselves that we are doing our best, or that such things really don't matter in the end, and so forth.

Advent reminds us not to play a dangerous game with our faith. When darkness is bleakest, we do not squander the oil we have for our lamps; we measure it and allot it such that we will have enough through the dark days.

With measured preparation then, let us therefore allocate the gifts which God has given us, for the time which he has given us, for the purposes for which he has given us.

We Will Plan to Deliver Dec. 19 as part of the Caroling Worship Service






Attendance and Offering: Last 8 Weeks
